

TEACHERS' EXAMS START AT J'VILLE DECEMBER 20TH

Examination for state certificates will be held at Jacksonville, Oregon, commencing at 9 o'clock Wednesday, Dec. 20, 1922, and continuing until Saturday at 4 o'clock p. m. of the same week.

Applicants must present themselves for the examinations they wish to take at the time set for the question envelopes to be opened, as the examinations cannot be offered at any other time or place. The rules and regulations regarding the examinations will be read at 9 o'clock on the morning of the first day. Those entering later in the week and wishing to take only a few of the examinations should present themselves at the secretary's desk for registration and for information regarding the rules. The eleven subjects required for a one year elementary certificate are underlined upon the program.

1 p. m. Physiology, manual training, composition, methods in reading.
2:30 p. m. Reading, course of study for drawing, methods in arithmetic, domestic science.

1 p. m. Grammar, stenography, American literature, physics, methods in language.
2:30 p. m. Geography, typewriting, thesis for primary certificate.

9 a. m. Theory and practice, physical geography, English literature, chemistry.
11 a. m. Spelling.
1 p. m. School law, geology, algebra.
2:30 p. m. Civil government.
Saturday Program
9 a. m. Geometry, botany.
1 p. m. General history, bookkeeping.

ASHLAND ELKS TO AID COMMUNITY HOSPITAL DRIVE

ASHLAND, Dec. 12.—Substantial improvements to the extent of an outlay of several thousand dollars made on both the exterior and interior of the Community Hospital, imply additional equipment. Several organizations contemplate furnishing individual rooms in the institution, the average cost being about \$250 per room. The Elks have already taken the initiative and will equip one of the suites at once, a committee having been appointed to arrange details. The Masonic bodies have the matter under advisement, the Shrine to take lead in the movement. The new community establishment is replete with all accessories applying to a hospital of the first rank, and it is planned to install every modern feature which is needed to complete the equipment. All physicians and surgeons of the county now have equal privileges at this institution.

Among merchandise establishments decorated during the winter fair, the Erns company was awarded first place, with Holmes grocery second, Swenson & Peabier, furniture dealers, were third. Among distinctive booths located directly at fair headquarters, the Vining theatre won in the competitive display, others ranking second and third respectively being the Detrick Groceries and Ashland Creamery. Quite an additional list were in the honorable mention classification.

In addition to a stock of rare articles in the jewelry line, the store of O. H. Johnson, as rearranged, is one of the exhibit places which would do justice to an emporium of metropolitan proportions. The store's interior has been entirely changed, with the result that splendid effects are obtained in the displays made in various departments, the collection in the aggregate forming a jewelry and fine art exhibit.

Quarters in the Shook block on North Main street are now occupied by Bob Middleton, who has moved his gun store to the new location.

Quite a few local boys are employed at the extensive lumber mills at Susanville, Cal., among the number being Roy Ashcraft, who with his wife, came to Ashland for the holiday vacation.

Christmas seals are being retailed and wholesaled this week in the form of a drive. Pupils of junior high and Hawthorne schools are leading in the annual campaign which, though launched December 11 in an intensive way, will be continued intermittently until the advent of the Christmas holidays.

Contributions for the purchase of an ambulance for the Community Hospital aggregate nearly \$1000 to date. At least \$1200 will be needed the acquisition to be left to a selection by local physicians who constitute a committee authorized to make the purchase.

Student members of the local military company will compete for one of the dozen or more units necessary for graduation from a standard high school, on the assumption that they attend drills regularly throughout the prescribed course, also meeting requirements of the annual training camp, the captain of the organization certifying to the attendance upon military service.

Supplementing Dr. Bishop, federal veterinarian, who is in this locality testing dairy cattle under government regulations in behalf of county and precinct localities, several representatives of leading livestock commission firms have been skimming

around here of late, including Ray Beckley, of a leading Portland concern, investigating conditions as to the status of livestock throughout the valley, both from the standpoint of numbers and bovine fitness as a preliminary to purchase and shipment to city markets.

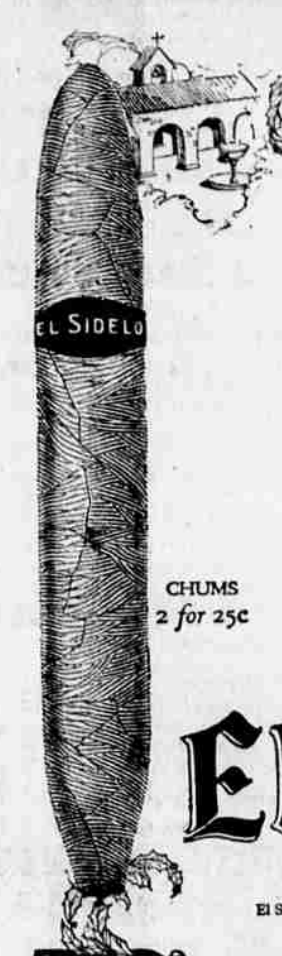

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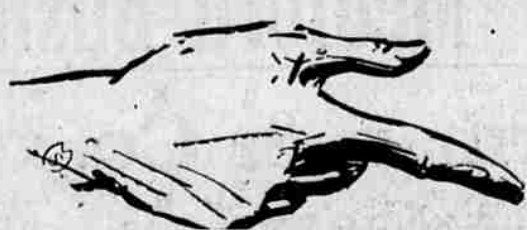
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
