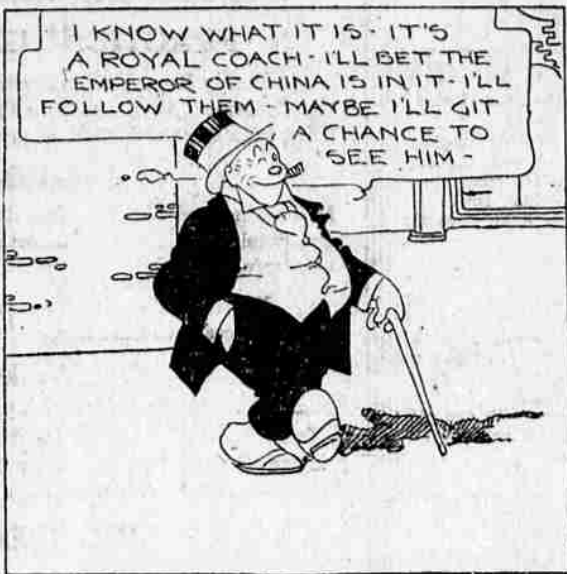
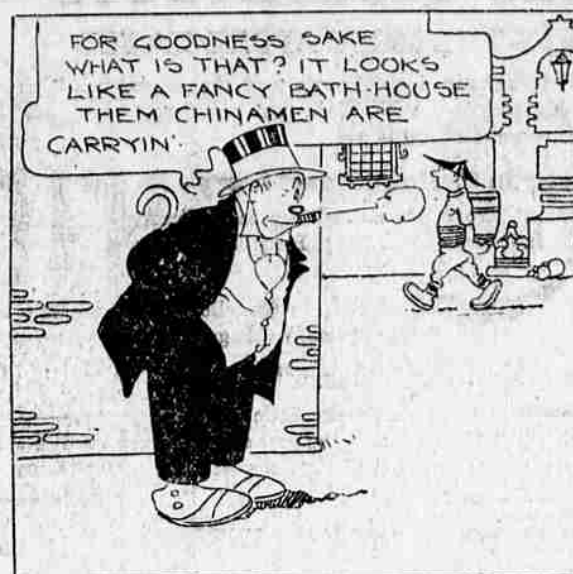
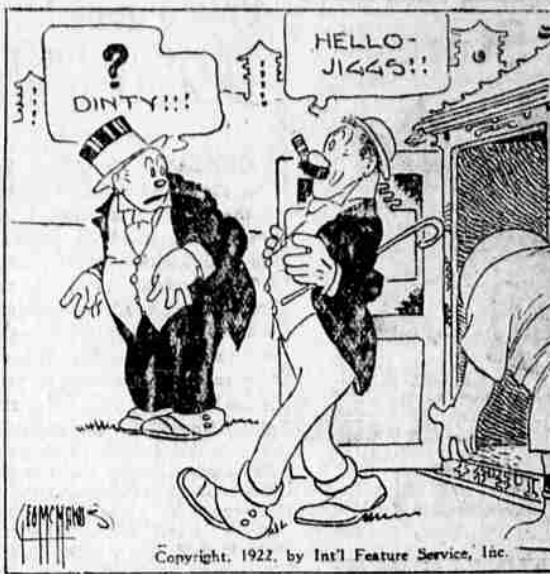

HOMEGROWN REDS IN JAIL RIOTOUS

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 14.—A call was received at the central police station shortly after noon today from the east side jail, saying that the prisoners were engaged in rioting and asking for help. Shotgun squads were started at once. About 100 prisoners, including numerous spectators, were confined in the jail which is in Boyle Heights.

The disturbance was created by 25 I. W. W. incarcerated for picketing. They hoisted red flags from the tanks and beat upon the cell doors, but were quieted upon arrival of police reinforcements from other stations.
