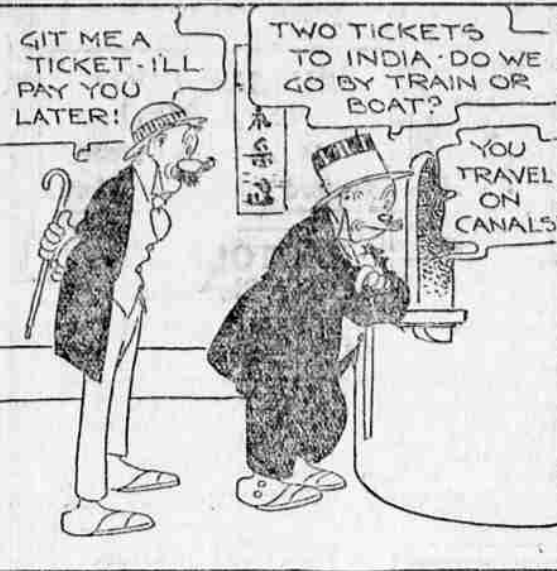

ASTORIA FIRE VIEWS AT PAGE TONIGHT FOR RELIEF WORK

F. W. Hudson of the Camera club of Portland, is here on a relief mission for the fire victims of Astoria. He will show a large number of screen pictures at the Page theater tonight, along with the regular big film show, and at Ashland tomorrow night, which illustrate the awful conditions that exist in what remains of the lower Columbia river metropolis. He drove one of the first relief cars into the fire stricken city and aided with the relief work committees. Photographs during the great fire and following it are being sent out by the Camera club, and will be seen at the Page tonight under Mr. Hudson's supervision and through the courtesy of the Page management. No solicitations for relief will be made at this time, but it is probable that a relief drive throughout the state will be made later on, and the pictures shown tonight, together with the fifteen minutes' lecture by Mr. Hudson will give local people an opportunity to learn the necessity for such relief. Mr. Hudson is a former resident of Medford and has a wide circle of local friends and acquaintances. When he resided here, he was in the electrical business.
