FINGERPRINTS ONLY CLUES FOUND TO DENVER BANDITS

DENVER, Dec. 21.—Photographs of the finger prints found on the bloody shotgun dropped by the masked bandits Monday in making their escape following the shooting and killing of Charles T. Linton, federal reserve guard, and theft of \$200,000, were forwarded today to Chief of Police Alderson of Vancouver, B. C., who requested the photographs, believing the Denver bandits to be the ones who perpetrated a \$73,000 robbery there.

At the same time photographic copies of the prints found on an abandoned automobile believed to have been left at a vantage point by the bandits were sent to Chief Alderson. Similar copies were sent to the Bertillon departments of practically every large eastern, western and southern city of the country, as well as to the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kans., in an effort to secure their identification. Records of the local police Bertillon department fail to identify the men.

PORTLAND'S LEPER GIVEN PRESENT

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 21.—The Christmas season has been made cheerful for Frank Haggerty, 52, Portland's only leper, who is confined in an isolated building under the supervision of the health department. EUROPEAN SUNDAY TO BE COMBATTED IN AUSTRALIA

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Dec.—The Australian Theatrical alliance is combining with the Anglican Synod to prevent the introduction into Australia of the continental Sunday.

The Synod already has adopted a motion strongly deprecating Sunday sport and it has resolved a letter from the Theatrical Alliance asking its cooperation in having "all places of amusement closed on Christmas Day and Good Friday, because at least two days of the year should be rendered sacred, and not allowed to drift into desecration and degradation."

"Experience teaches that with the presentation of these two days the Continental Sundays will surely follow with all theatres open and as many as five performances being given in one theater on one day," the letter said. "The result is that Sunday would be a most sacrilegious day, the sacred atmosphere dissipated and moral streams of life would be polluted."
