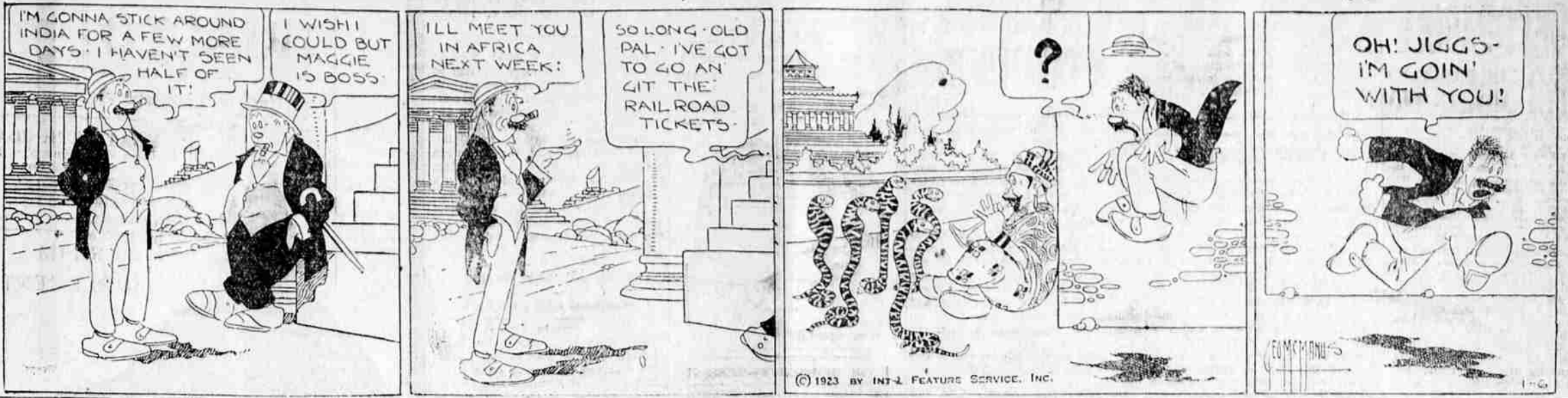


BRINGING UP FATHER

"The art of the screen," says Robert Vignola, "has been criticized because it exhibits life as soundless. So it does. So, too, does the art of the novel, the canvas and epic poetry. The complaint lodges against motion pictures because they are conceived to be an articulate imitation of the drama, and that is largely the fault of producers and directors of pictures.
