

SCHAEFER VICTOR,
WINS CHANCE TO
PLAY HOPPE AGAIN

CHICAGO, Jan. 11.—Jake Schaefer of San Francisco today is entitled to another try for the 18.2 balk line billiard championship which Willie Hoppe wrested from the elder Schaefer, "the wizard," and has held for seventeen years except last year, when Young Jake astonished the billiard world by capturing it in tournament play and defending it in match play against Hoppe.

Schaefer emerged victor over Roger Conti in a poorly played 1500 point three night match here last night 1500 to 781.

Conti last night was able to average but 83-16 and his grand average was 18.25-42. Schaefer averaged 29.7-17 in the final block and his grand average was 34.38-43. Conti's high run was 115, scored on the opening night, and Schaefer's 160, collected on the second night.

The Schaefer-Hoppe match for the world title probably will be played in New York in March.

TROOPS' RETURN IS
HELD MISFORTUNE

MANCHESTER, England, Jan. 11.—Commenting upon the withdrawal of American troops from the Rhine, the Manchester Guardian terms the American decision a misfortune. Explaining why it considers the withdrawal inopportune, the Guardian says the chief object of the French policy has been to detach the Rhineland permanently from Germany and that this would be easier if that district were emptied of British and American forces.

"Separation of the Rhineland from Germany would be the greatest imaginable menace to the future of the world," the newspaper continues. "We should do nothing to help such a move. There should be English forces in the Rhineland so long as there are French forces in the Ruhr."

NEGRO FRESHMAN
DENIED ROOM AT
HARVARD 'DORM'

NEW YORK, Jan. 11.—A request of Roscoe Conklin Bruce, a negro graduate of Harvard university, that a room be reserved in the freshman halls at Harvard for his son, has been refused by President A. Lawrence Lowell, a letter published in the New York World today disclosed.

Replying to Mr. Bruce, President Lowell wrote:

"I am sorry to have to tell you that in the freshman halls where residence is compulsory, we have felt from the beginning the necessity of not including colored men. To the other dormitories and dining rooms they are admitted freely, but in the freshman halls I am sure you will understand why, from the beginning, we have not thought it possible to compel men of different races to reside together."

Bruce, who lives at Kendall, W. Va., is the son of Blanch Kelso Bruce, former registrar of the United States treasury. He was a member of the class of 1902, won membership in Phi Beta Kappa and was chosen class orator. The son is preparing to enter Harvard at Phillips Exeter academy.
