Clashes at Dortmund. DORTMUND, Jan. 17.—(By the Associated Press.)—Demonstrations by nationalists in Dortmund late last night caused clashes with communistic labor elements, but intervention by the French forces was not necessitated.
The French have reinforced the troops of occupation here, as further trouble is expected tonight. The nationalists intend to hold a street parade which General Rampon, the French commander, has forbidden.

BERLIN, Jan. 17.—(By the Associated Press.)—It was stated in official quarters today that the German government sees no reason for expulsion of French subjects from Germany.
There is still no sign that France is interfering with the movement of coal from the Ruhr district to unoccupied Germany.
