The bill reported out favorably in the legislature yesterday was one by Representative Graham of Washington county permitting school districts to exceed their limit for bonded indebtedness through a period of time necessary for refunding of outstanding bond issues. This is desired as a means of saving the high school of Forest Grove approximately \$2000 in refunding a \$35,000 bond issue on which the refunding option will expire June 1, next. It also would apply to several other school districts of Oregon as a means of saving considerable money by permitting refunding proceedings where the bonding limit would be exceeded during the period of readjustment.
