ANOTHER CHANCE FOR COW TESTING MAY BE GIVEN

The final check on the testing of the cows of Medford was made yesterday. Only one hundred and ten cows were tested whereas Ashland, a much smaller town had three times as many cows. In Ashland the city council aided the T. B. drive by promising strict observance of the sign regarding the sale of milk and milk products.

In Medford two cows reacted to tuberculosis test while another was strongly suspicious, making in reality three reactors. Of the cows found tubercular in the county so far, all but two were in fine condition and appeared as healthy as the best. This fact takes care of the argument put forth by many of the users of milk. "Our cow is perfectly healthy, never coughs a bit, and I am sure she is all right."

The county agent's office is doing all that it can to clean up the disease in the county but the support of the cow owners is necessary. Owners were urged to send in their names on sign petitions which were circulated earlier in the season, stating their location and the number of cattle they had. Too small a percentage did this and now that the testing has been done in their community some write in or phone in and want the testing or wonder why they were passed up.

The testing is being done by the federal government and is free, but in return the farmer is supposed to cooperate in helping to get Dr. Bishop, the tester, around. By being ready it does not mean that the cattle be in a corral ranging from a foot deep in mud to two acres in size, but tied up or in stanchions.

Fifty per cent of the loss of time is from having to wait for the cows to be caught and the doctor asserts that it will be necessary to pass up those which are not up, ready, for his time is demanded elsewhere.

As was expected, calls have begun to come in from those in town who missed the test. If there is sufficient demand another chance will be offered to get the cows to a central point and have them tested at a later date.

The work has been completed south of a line between Jacksonville and Medford extended. If you are in the untested area and wish testing don't hesitate to get your name and location in to Mr. Cate's office, if you haven't already made the fact known.

COUNTY FAIR MEETING LIBRARY TOMORROW
