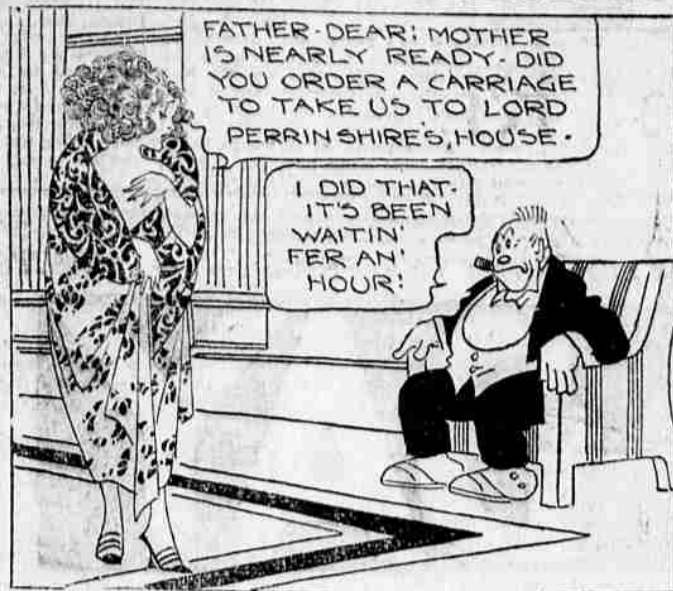

TOKIO, Jan. 26.—(By the Associated Press.)—Charles Beecher Warren, the retiring American ambassador and Mrs. Warren were entertained today with a farewell luncheon at the imperial palace. In the absence of the prince regent, who is in the country recuperating from his recent attack of measles, Prince and Princess Kuni were hosts. Mr. and Mrs. Warren also were received in a farewell audience by the emperor.
