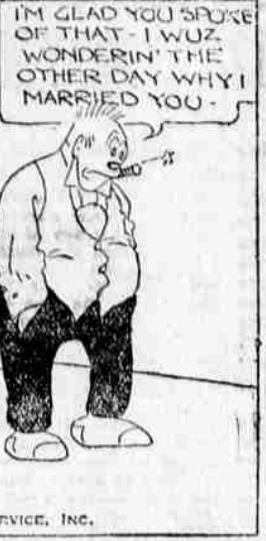

COUNTY HEALTH NURSE QUESTION IS ARGUED AGAIN

The county court was occupied again this morning by the county nurse question, and after a spirited session, it was announced that the matter would be taken under advisement. A delegation from Ashland, headed by Mrs. Fred Putnam and Mrs. Couzens appeared, and contested the appointment of a nurse on the grounds of economy, "coercion of parents," and opposition to health measures such as removal of the tonsils and adenoids. Continuation of the county nurse was advocated by Mrs. Fred Meares, Mrs. H. A. Noblitt, Dr. W. W. P. Holt, Superintendent of Schools A. G. Smith and Captain H. A. Canaday. They stressed the health advantages gained, as offsetting any monetary consideration, and told of the works and deeds of the county nurse the last year as proof. There were about 60 people present, and it is expected that the county court will reach a decision before there is a chance to hold another meeting.

MERCURY DROPS TO LOWEST POINT OF THE WINTER

The present cold wave here has been the coldest of the winter so far and there is no let up in sight, as the prediction for tonight and Thursday is for continued cold. The minimum temperature of this morning was 15.5 degrees above, following the maximum of 39 degrees yesterday. The coldest previous weather of the winter had been on one or two mornings when the temperature went as low as 20 degrees above. The cold wave exists all over Western Oregon and Northern California, but this vicinity seems to be more fortunate in that it has had much less snow. The water pipes were frozen in a number of homes last night and this morning despite the fact that in many homes the water was allowed to run slowly from the faucets in the house as a protection from freezing. The ground was frozen hard and all water standing in pools out of doors was converted into solid ice. The water of Butte creek in the vicinity of the intake of the city water works, 30 miles from the city was frozen yesterday morning and this morning, but the caretaker there was able with assistance from nearby to keep the intake clear of ice, without calling on the water department here for help. Eight inches of snow was reported at the intake vicinity yesterday.

ceedings should be brought to a termination as he hoped they might be by common consent. Lord Curzon said the treaty was intended to build up relationships of amity, good will and friendly intercourse on equal terms between the Turkish state and the other powers of Europe. "Peace, reconstruction and cooperation are the three objects," he said. He added that the question was how far the conference had succeeded in obtaining them in the present meetings. He was far from thinking their labors had been in vain as a considerable amount of suspicion which had hung about the earlier meetings had blown away by the breezes of Lausanne. Lord Curzon said he wanted the world to pronounce whether the settlement offered Turkey was just and generous and whether it afforded opportunity for Turkey to reconstitute her life "without external intervention or internal servitude." Compared with the treaty of Sevres the present document was generosity itself, he said. Nothing could be gained by the recommencement of hostilities he said.
