THE GOVERNOR AND CONSOLIDATION.

THE BEST reason for passing the Hall consolidation measure is that Governor Pierce wants it passed.

The responsibility for reduction of taxes in Oregon during the next few years will fall upon the Governor. The Governor, therefore, should be given the tools he wants, unless his demands are beyond all reason.

The argument that the Hall bill will give the Governor too much power is ridiculous. In the direction of administration the Governor can't have too much power, any more than the directing head of a big corporation can have too much power.

The argument that the Hall measure will allow the Governor to build up a big political machine is another foolish objection. No one knows better than Governor Pierce, a Democrat in a Republican state, that if he sacrifices efficiency and the welfare of the state, to politics he will commit political suicide.

And Governor Pierce doesn't want to commit suicide! Governor Pierce sincerely wants to give the people of Oregon the best that is in him, the most economical and efficient administration that he can devise. He asks for certain things so this may be accomplished. Let him have them. The Hall bill in our judgment doesn't go too far. In the way of simplification and expense reduction it doesn't go far enough.

But if it is what the Governor wants and apparently it is, give it to him.

News Summary of Last Night

WASHINGTON—Customs officials estimated that duties collected on imports will exceed \$480,000,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30.

DUESSELDORF—The French and Belgian seized customs houses and several bonded warehouses and collected the duties, expelling German officials who resisted.

MISKRA, Algeria—Barbet, an aviator, flew eight hours 26 minutes, 55 seconds in a glider, bettering the figure made by Lieutenant Manoyrol at Cherbourg, who flew eight hours, 4 minutes; but the new figure did not establish a record because no official timekeeper was present.

LOUISVILLE—J. D. Powers, former president of the American Bankers' association, died.

LONDON—A Milan dispatch to the Times said that Professor Parodi, eminent Dante scholar, died.

England Prepares for Rate War On Sea With America

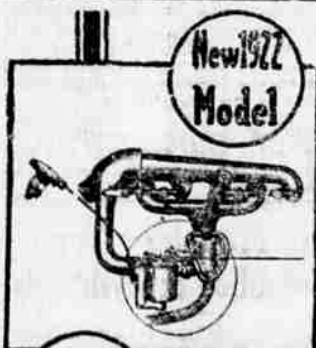
LONDON, Feb. 1.—(By the Associated Press)—The prospect of increased Atlantic passenger traffic during the coming summer is featured in the morning newspapers with announcement of a rate reduction and the proposed extension of the service of the United States lines with Southampton as the terminal port here.

Work begins today in the conversion of one of the berths at Southampton into a deep water dock to accommodate the Leyland. The estimated cost of this enterprise is more than 10,000,000 pounds. The plans include the construction of five other docks capable of receiving the largest liners.

Officials of the White Star, Cunard and Canadian Pacific lines in Liverpool says the West Minister Gazette, declare they do not fear American competition. They base their confidence partly upon the fact that the American ships will be "dry." They realize competition is likely to be keen and some of them look for a rate war.

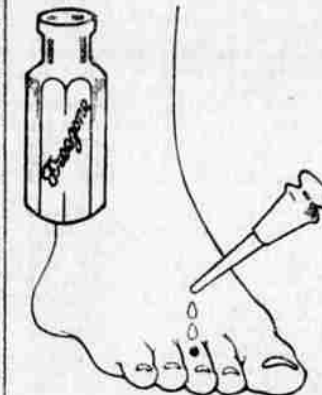
He declared: "You poison chickens, Maclyn Dickens!" The plot now thickens; Glackens took a whack at Dickens.
