NO HAND-PICKED GRAND JURY IN MER ROUGE CASE

BASTROP, La., Feb. 14.—The next official step of the investigation of the Morehouse kidnaping cases, which resulted in the death of Watt Daniel and T. F. Richard last August will be the drawing on March 5 of the names of the twelve men who will comprise the grand jury who will select the jury.

It was announced by Attorney General A. V. Coo that he would be ready to present the testimony obtained at the hearing of several weeks ago to the new grand jury when it convened on the first Monday in March. It was also reported that he would inquire into the record of the men composing the jury panel.

BRONSON, Fla., Feb. 14.—Twenty-five witnesses have been summoned to appear today before the special grand jury here investigating the recent Rosewood race clash in which two white men and six negroes lost their lives and the negro section of Rosewood was wiped out by fire.
