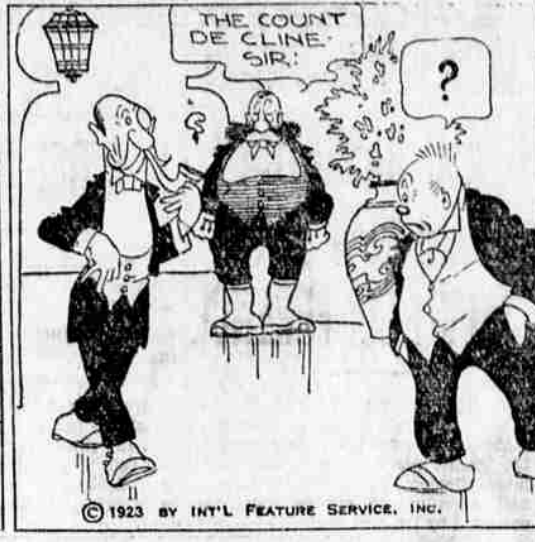


## BRINGING UP FATHER

92 YEAR OLD CO-ED  
DIES IN WISCONSIN

RACINE, Wis., Feb. 19.—Mrs. Amy Davis Winship, 92, widely known as the "oldest university co-ed" in the United States died here today at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Parkwooster. She had made her home there since 1870.

Mrs. Winship entered the Ohio State university when 78 years old. During the ten years which followed she studied also at the Universities of Wisconsin, California, Kansas, Texas and Florida.

She devoted her time chiefly to the study of metaphysics and sociology.

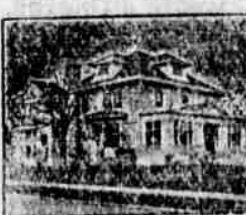
