GOVERNMENT SPYS ARE MEMBERS OF RED ORGANIZATION

CHICAGO, Feb. 23.—Part of the government's methods in keeping informed on radical movements stood revealed today as a result of testimony given here in a deposition hearing directed by Frank P. Walsh, attorney defending 22 alleged communist party members facing trial for violation of Michigan's syndicalism law.

The information was contained in testimony given by Allen O. Meyers, assistant general manager of the W. J. Burns detective agency, who yesterday said a government agent, K-97, whom he named as Francis Morrow, alias Ashworth, attended the meeting of radicals at Bridgman, Mich., last August.

Morrow, according to Meyers' testimony, held a membership in the communist party and was one of those arrested in the raid at Bridgman, spending two days in jail before he was recognized as a government agent and released.

NEW REGIME IN IRELAND TO RULE WITH IRON HAND

DUBLIN.—The free state's ruling extending the death penalty to cover a wide range of crimes heretofore dealt with as petty, has convinced the average Irish citizen that the new regime means business and realizes that the time has come to test its powers to govern.

The effect of the new ruling is to apply the death penalty fearlessly to every person proved to be assisting in any way the campaign of the irregulars against the constituted government. In future the mere possession of hostile plans or documents, and the unauthorized possession of military uniforms, will involve the death penalty. Threatening letters have been falling like snowflakes on all prominent supporters of the government, but now the sending of a threatening letter will involve penal servitude.

Trials for all these anti-state offenses will be held by private by military courts. Although some deputies, including Mr. Fitzgerald, member for Trinity College, hesitated at conferring such broad powers upon the army, General Mulcahy's insistence on their caused his opponents to waive their objections, and in the vote on the question the government had no opponents, except 13 members of the labor party. There has been some expression of uneasiness regarding the silence of the army on the exact condition of the country, and this has been criticized by such papers as the Irish Times, but there is a disposition on the part of the average citizen to give the new ruling a chance to prove its worth.

No New Immigration Laws Expected to Pass This Session Congress

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.—New immigration restriction legislation apparently is dead so far as this session of congress is concerned.

While the proposed substitute for the existing statute is ready for house action, senate leaders are averse to bringing up so important a measure at the end of the session with calendars already crowded, especially in view of the fact that the present immigration law does not expire until July 30, 1924.

There are two general policies proposed in the new measure which undoubtedly would lead to an extended discussion in the session. One is writing into law of the "gentleman's agreement" with Japan and the other is the proposal to reduce the limits of immigration from the present three per cent on the 1910 census to 2 per cent on the 1890 census.

U. S. Chamber of Commerce Oppose Fed'l. Education

BOSTON, Feb. 23.—A referendum taken recently by the chamber of commerce of the United States resulted in a decisive vote against the creation of a federal department of education, the Boston chamber of commerce, affiliated with the national organization, announced today. The vote on the referendum was, for 447½; against, 1,291½.

The membership of the national chamber also voted 1069 to 590 against enlarging the present federal bureau of education, it was announced.

Another question submitted to the membership was:

"Do you favor the principle of federal aid to education in the states on the basis of the states appropriating sums equal to those given by the federal government?"

The vote was for 576½; against, 1173½.

START MOVE TO ELIMINATE STONE-WEBSTER INTEREST

SEATTLE, Feb. 23.—A third party is planned to "eliminate the sinister influence of the Stone and Webster interests from state politics," William A. Gilmore of this city announced last night. Mr. Gilmore has been identified with the republican party forty years. He was mayor of Nome, Alaska, two terms, and was a justice of the Illinois supreme court. Last fall he was a candidate for the Washington state senate.

Mr. Gilmore said that Homer T. Bone of Tacoma, member of the legislature, would probably be the candidate of the new party for governor.

The program of the proposed party, as outlined by Mr. Gilmore, includes initiation of a bill to permit municipalities to sell electric power outside their limits, similar to that offered by Mr. Bone in the legislature and repeal of the administrative code governing the executive branch of the state government.

CRONKHITE CLAIMS AUTOPSY JUGGLED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 23.—A charge that the record of the autopsy over the body of his son, Major Alexander P. Cronkhite, was "falsified," was made today by Major General Adelbert Cronkhite whose recent enforced retirement from active service is under inquiry by several members of the senate.

General Cronkhite, who attributes the order retiring him to his efforts to clear up the mystery of his son's death in 1918 at Camp Lewis, Wash., said in a statement that he had asked the war department for all his papers in the case, but had been furnished only with a "grossly imperfect" set of documents. The department, he said, apparently had been satisfied with these records, despite the fact that they were not in accordance with army regulations.

POLAND OBJECTS TO COUNCIL DECISION

PARIS, Feb. 23.—(By Associated Press). The government set up early in January at Memel by Lithuanian insurgents and M. Simonatis has notified the council of ambassadors that it accepts the decision of the council by which Memel is to become part of Lithuania.

A dispatch to the Havas agency from Warsaw says the Polish diet has adopted a resolution demanding that the Polish government take the necessary action to secure the guarantee to Poland of her rights to the full use of the port of Memel.

The resolution was adopted after a discussion during which it was declared Lithuania was a docile instrument in the hands of the Russians and Germans, to the menace of the peace of eastern Europe.
