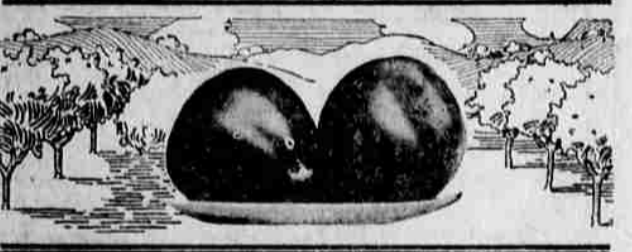

TOM SAWYER AND HUCK FINN COME TO FRONT AGAIN

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., March 8.—(By the Associated Press)—Shades of Tom Sawyer and Huckleberry Finn hovered about the offices of Illinois' chief executive today.

Masters Marvel and Enlow, "detectives and manhunters," have offered their services to the state. Upon receipt of a supply of "rifles and revolvers," high powered, and the promise of \$5 a week, these two boys say they are prepared to start immediately "hunting distilleries of white mule."

That these sleuths are ready for business is indicated by a letter received by Governor Small, which said in part:

"Dear Sir: Thought we might get a job as detective or hunting distillers of white mule or any other alcoholic drinks, there is two of us, names are A. H. Marvel and J. W. Enlow. We are in the seventh yr. grade. Our school will be out in April we can begin the hunt about the first Saturday in April if you want us to hunt them send us two colts automatics and two highpowered rifles and ammunition. The rifles and revolvers will be returned next fall when our school begins. Will work for \$6 a week."

RUSHING APPLES TO CHICAGO MKT.

CHICAGO, Mar. 8.—While weather forecasters pointed out the fallacy of predicting the coming of spring by the "lion and lamb" method, marketmen today advanced what they termed an unfailing indication of the season's nearness, the arrival of heavy shipments of stored apples on the markets.

The rush of shippers to get their stored apples to market was compared in some quarters to the tempestuous charge of a March lion.

Western states sent 1260 carloads of apples to market during the week. The United States bureau of agricultural economics said today, more than any time since the middle of January, Washington forwarded 1040 cars of that total, 17 per cent more than the preceding week and 70 per cent over the amount in the corresponding period of last year.

Eastern sections shipped 725 cars of barreled stock, 640 cars of which came from New York. Shipments from that state for the week showed an increase of 75 per cent over last week and 70 per cent over the similar period of last year.

OLEO BILL WILL BE REFERENCED

SALEM, Ore., Mar. 8.—The Associated Industries of Oregon has taken formal steps here to invoke the referendum on the so-called "oleo" bill passed by the last legislature intended to prohibit the use of milk products in the manufacture of oleomargarine and Butter and milk substitutes. The secretary of state and attorney general have been asked to prepare referendum forms and ballot title for the vote on the measure at the 1924 general election.

STEEL CHAIN STORES IN RECEIVER'S HANDS

BUFFALO, N. Y., March 8.—Receivers were appointed in federal court here today for the L. R. Steel enterprises in which the public has invested about \$22,000,000. L. R. Steel, the promoter, severed his connection with the companies of which there were nearly a score, on January 27, and since then direction of the Steel enterprises has been in the hands of a board of control. The receivers were appointed on a suit in equity brought to conserve the assets of the various corporations.

The petitioner is the National Toy and Tinsel Manufacturing company of Mantwaoc.

HERRIN OUTRAGE IS APPROVED BY LABOR

GREAT FALLS, Mont., Mar. 8.—The Montana State Federation of Labor in its 28th annual convention in Great Falls endorsed the action of the striking miners in Herrin, Ill., and in resolutions adopted unanimously by the convention declared that the Herrin miners were justified and extended sympathy and wishes "for a speedy acquittal" of those miners now being tried for murder before the court at Marion, Ill.

FEVER AT 114 FOR 19 DAYS, PATIENT SURE OF RECOVERY

ESCANABA, Mich., Mar. 8.—With the start of the nineteenth day of her temperature of 114 degrees or better, Miss Evelyn Lyons, 30, chatted freely with her friends at her home here. She seemed to be resting better, her pulse beat more normally and her face still retained its clear look. Her temperature, however, remained at 114 degrees.

The woman's former complaints against confinement gave way to a smile and she expressed her gratitude for the thirty telegrams and a flood of letters and postcards of consolation and advice which she has received from persons all over the country.

"I wish the Associated Press to thank all of these people for me," Miss Lyons declared. "I am glad to have their comfort in my fight for recovery and I would like to thank each one separately. I know I will recover."

"I wish that I could get out though," she said, "because I know that I would be better off if I got out into the cold air."

HOOVER BLAMED FOR HIGH PRICE SUGAR

NEW YORK, March 8.—Arriving from France on the Majestic last night, Mr. Sprockles, chairman of the Federal Sugar Refining company, declared that the United States faces another serious sugar shortage, similar to the one that occurred when Herbert Hoover was food administrator unless the department of commerce stops "issuing statements" on the situation.

The recent rise in the price of sugar, Mr. Sprockles asserted, "was due to a gamblers' market assisted by the department of commerce."

"The American people have been mulcted out of millions of dollars," he said, "and the ultimate result will be the same as when Mr. Hoover was food administrator."
