

DEWEY & OREGON JONES ATTEMPT TO ESCAPE FROM PEN

"While the Lions minstrel show was in progress at the state penitentiary Saturday night, five of the most desperate convicts in the institution were sawing their way through the roof of the north cell house, and starting for liberty," says the Salem Capital Journal. "Stool pigeons warned the prison officials just in the nick of time and the escape was thwarted when the men were rounded up in the prison yard as they were getting ready to go over the wall."

"The men engaged in the attempted escape included Ellsworth Kelly, Oregon and Dewey Jones, brothers, George Hotislaw and George Jackson, everyone of them as hard-boiled as the proverbial picnic egg, and some of them leading figures in successful jailbreaking in the past."

The Jones brothers, who are well known in Medford and other parts of Jackson county, and Ellsworth Kelly, were recently sentenced in circuit court at Grants Pass by Judge C. M. Thomas to heavy sentences, on being found guilty of committing a number of auto holdup robberies in the vicinity of Grants Pass and Medford, including the robbery and holding up of a number of Medford autos near this city one night as their occupants were returning from the fair grounds pavilion, and taking them in one of the cars to Blackwell hill where they were released.
