

IRISH ARRESTS TO BE EXPLAINED BY BONAR LAW GOVT.

LONDON, March 15.—(By the Associated Press.) The uneasiness that has followed last Sunday's Irish arrests in Great Britain has induced Kingsley Wood, member of the House of Commons, to introduce a bill which he will produce next Tuesday amending the measure proposed that in the event of future deportations under the act, the home secretary be obliged to inform the advisory committee established by the act and that within a week this committee must consider whether the deportation is just and reasonable. The persons affected would have the right to attend the hearing.

Members of parliament do not believe that the bill will have the least chance of passing the house but its introduction will give the government an opportunity to make clear its position, which now is rather obscure.

Gold Imports Lower.

WASHINGTON, March 15.—Imports of gold into the United States during February, were valued at \$8,273,600 and were smaller than those any month in the last three years. Gold exports totaled \$1,399,089, or to the average.

CHINA WOBLES AS JAPAN RAPS TREATY DEMAND

PEKING, March 15.—(By the Associated Press.) Tokyo's rejection of China's effort to abrogate the 21 demands treaty of 1915, to reclaim Dairen and Port Arthur from Japanese hands running half a century, has caused no surprise in political circles here where the nature of Japan's reply was anticipated.

There is no immediate prospect of a further rejoinder. It is generally considered that the Peking government's chief desire in sending the note was to comply with the demand of China that they preserve the record as objecting to the continuation of the treaty, in view of the approaching expiration of the old leases on Dairen and Port Arthur which are extended fifty years under the new pact.

Under the present nebulous state of the Chinese cabinet interest in Japan's attitude is overshadowed by the greater question of the immediate future of the Peking government. It is conceded generally that even should the present ministerial truce result in the cabinet's retracting definitely its proffered resignation, the country has no guarantee that there will be no further coercion on the part of militarists. Furthermore, there is evidence of a lack of solidarity among members of the cabinet. The course to be pursued is the subject of much speculation. The likelihood is that several portfolios will be changed. The foreign minister has been in his office only long enough to receive the Japanese reply.

STRIKE GAS WELL IN WASHINGTON

EVERETT, Wash., March 15.—A strong flow of gas has been obtained from a well 120 feet deep, drilled on the ranch of A. E. Amundsen, at Swan's trail, two miles from here. It issues from the well with a roar and is inflammable. Some time ago a flow of gas was tapped when a well was being drilled for water on the same ranch. Amundsen says he proposes to sink another and larger shaft.

W. HOPPE RETAINS CUE CHAMPIONSHIP SCORE, 1500-1341

NEW YORK, March 15.—The cue world is still a magic wand, its wizard still the invincible master of the ivory. Young Jake Schaefer, son of the "old wizard" knows it today. Hoppe completed his defense of his 18.2 ball line billiard world's championship title last night, amassing 1500 points in the three blocks of his challenge match while the San Francisco was totaling 1341.

Vivid with drama and color and replete throughout with displays of emotion and temperament, the three-day tournament came to a finish that swept the 1500 spectators from their seats. The end of the first block, Schaefer led 500 to 277. The next night Hoppe made 723 points to Schaefer's 194.

Hoppe came to the table last night six points ahead. He counted 43 before he missed an easy one-shotted draw. Hoppe never lost the lead and though he wavered several times near the end, as did Schaefer, he maintained control. Hoppe used every conceivable shot with unerring daring. His speed was unmatchable.

Besides losing his title, he won permanent possession of the \$1000 diamond medal emblematic of the championship, and his side wager of \$1000 with Schaefer. He will not be subject to challenge until a new trophy is offered.

DEMPSEY OFFERED \$750,000 CASH FIGHT WITH FIRPO

LOS ANGELES, Mar. 15.—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight boxing champion, early today was still awaiting word from his manager, Jack Kearns in New York, for details of an offer he said he had received to meet Luis Firpo at Buenos Aires last night. The Los Angeles Examiner said Dempsey had been offered a purse of \$750,000 plus \$25,000 for training expenses and 75 per cent of the motion picture rights.

South American promoters are in New York to confer with Kearns, according to information Dempsey says he received from his manager.

"Of course the match is not clinched yet," said Dempsey, "but my information is that it will be. I have been in communication with my manager daily and nightly and he seems to think it will be only a matter of a few days before closing the match."

"Firpo is unquestionably a good fighter," he said.

Meanwhile Dempsey is looking for more sparring partners to join two or three who are working with him each day. He has been training since his arrival some time ago and says he is in good condition.

NEW YORK, Mar. 15.—(By Associated Press.) Tex Rickard, Madison Square Garden promoter today declared that Jack Dempsey, heavyweight champion, cannot accept an offer of \$750,000, reported to have been made by Argentine promoters for a fight with Luis Angel Firpo in Buenos Aires in November, because of a contract under which the South American pugilist has agreed to box solely under Rickard's direction for a year.

Brennan Recovers.

NEW YORK, March 15.—Bill Brennan, Chicago heavyweight, is expected to leave the hospital where he sought relief yesterday from concussion of the brain resulting from the knockout blow delivered by Louis Firpo in their bout Monday within a few days but it will be a long time before he is ready to enter the ring.

Brennan's condition never was critical and surgeons who examined

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X-ray pictures taken of his skull said that no serious injury was done. They found that the left side of his head from behind the ear to the left temple and from the parietal bone to the base of the skull, was inflamed. They said today that he was improving and anticipated no dangerous developments.

Brennan admitted that it was the worst beating he ever had received. Beside the head injury and body bruises, Brennan hurt a bone in his right foot—the same leg he broke when Jack Dempsey wove him one of his other two knockouts.

The Chicago boxer is said to have himself open to such blows as those administered by Firpo. It was the "rabbit punch" or one of its variations that caused the knockout. When weathering a storm Brennan crouched behind his arms, leaving the back of his head and neck unprotected.

Firpo called twice at the hospital.

with an interpreter to hear solemnly a "Senior Brennan" but was not permitted within the sick room.
