METHODIST REVIVAL TO CLOSE SUNDAY WITH BIG RALLY

In what was said by some to be the strongest sermon yet preached by Dr. Huff, the noted evangelist last night spoke on the text, "Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these?" The minister said in part: "The questions of Jesus are like great searchlights, they show the direction one is going. When Jesus stood on the shore of Tiberias, in the mist of morning, and said to Simon Peter, 'Lovest thou me?' he asked the superlative question of Christianity. Christianity at its best is a great affection for God that prompts obedience to the Heavenly Father and service for humanity."

"There is no gift nor power that you can get by divine endowment that will hold you straight three hundred sixty five days in the year if you have not a great love for Jesus Christ. It is Christ's love of true discipleship. We may exalt the Saviour to the throne of the universe; we may admire his transcendent truth; we may stand in awe before his majesty and yet not know, in genuine reality, love for him. Peter had forsaken all he had, acknowledged Christ's divinity, and had said he was willing to die, but with all he had fallen in genuine allegiance. We have love for creed and love for church, but our supreme need is a great, vital, pulsating love for Jesus Christ."

"He is the great lover who must have first place in your heart or no place at all. Just as no woman would be satisfied with a fine home, the best automobile, expensive clothing and a large bank account without the love of her husband, so all of our formal, empty ceremonies are meaningless to Christ if our lives show that we are devoid of a genuine affection for him."

"What do you have in your home when love between man and wife goes out. You answer, 'Domestic infelicity.' Let me put it plainer. You have domestic hell. So if love for Christ has gone out of your heart you will not be happy."

The revival will close Sunday with three great services. Dr. Huff will speak at 11 o'clock, 3 and 7:30. At the 3 o'clock hour he will deliver his address on South America. The evangelist spends seven months of every other year in touring South America in evangelistic work.
