WASHINGTON, April 10.—Nine states, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Delaware, Indiana, Kentucky, Minnesota, Pennsylvania and Virginia, filed in the supreme court today a joint brief as friends of the state of Massachusetts to challenge the constitutionality of the maternity law.
