U. S. DEMAND FOR
PRIORITY RIGHTS
HALT CONFERENCE

PARIS, April 17.—(By the Associated Press)—An American demand for absolute priority on German reparations to pay the costs of the American army of occupation on the Rhine was continuing today to deadlock the conference here over this question, it was stated in well informed quarters.

Elliot Wadsworth, assistant secretary of the treasury, representing the United States, was awaiting a call for another conference session from the representatives of the allies, who meanwhile were awaiting instructions from their governments. Mr. Wadsworth declared there was no warrant for the statement that the conference had broken up.

The allied delegates assert that if absolute priority were given the United States the first effort would be to block German shipments of coal to Italy and also to force the British government to pay the costs of its army on the Rhine or else withdraw it. This latter point is disputed in informed circles, where it is asserted that the British now are getting more from the Germans than the cost of their army through the recovery act, which in straight receipts is yielding annually 6,800,000, it is stated.
