"The road from Medford to Klamath Falls by way of Crater Lake will be 50 per cent better this year than it was last," said Will T. Lee, Klamath county assessor and holder of the Crater Lake National park motor concession, in Portland Wednesday.

"Of the 80 miles from Medford to Crater Lake 50 miles will be macadamized. Of the 65 miles from Klamath Falls to Crater Lake 42 miles will be macadamized. The detours will be limited and will largely consist of passages over the old road. According to present prospects to road to Crater Lake will be open about July 1. We expect a travel this year that may prove to be double that of last year."—Portland Journal.
