Last evening at the Hotel Medford the captain expressed the wish before the company's departure this morning for Eugene that when he next visited Medford he hoped this city would have a golf course where he could play.

R. R. EXPRESSMEN ASK FOR WAGE INCREASE

CHICAGO, April 24.—Formal request for pay increase, the first of many such requests expected within the next few months, has been filed with the United States railroad labor board by the Order of Railroad Expressmen, it was announced today. This request asks for a ten cent per hour boost for each of the seventy thousand expressmen of the organization, making a total annual increase of slightly more than \$17,000,000 and it affects every carrier of the country. This, as well as other pay increase requests will not be taken up by the labor board until the three vacancies caused by the expiration of the terms of three board members on April 15, are filled by appointments which President Harding is expected to make soon.
