

SAYS PROHIBITION FINDS FAVOR WITH PEOPLE OF CHILE

CHICAGO, April 27.—(By Associated Press). As far as the cause being supported by powerful political factors is concerned, Chile is on the verge of prohibition, according to Bishop William F. Oldham, resident bishop of the Methodist Episcopal church at Buenos Aires who recently arrived at Chicago.

"With the president of Chile an ardent prohibitionist and with the power of the labor party behind the movement, the sentiment in favor of prohibition has grown by leaps and bounds," said Bishop Oldham. "The only obstacle now is the economic one of the disposition of their vast vineyards. Delegations from Chile have gone in the past year to California and Italy to study the possibilities of the raisin industry as a means of saving the value of the vineyards on the advent of prohibition. With the solution of this problem I believe that prohibition will be an easy matter in Chile."

"The Chilean people are studying prohibition as it is in evidence in the United States, and a great deal of information has been spread before them through the medium of the press."

MOSCOW—Nikolai Lenin, Premier of Russia, may die at any moment or he may live an indefinite length of time, but he will never recover, say physicians who have been attending him since his recent stroke of paralysis.

Thousands gather daily in the street before the Kremlin, the Czar's Moscow palace where Lenin has his apartments, to read the bulletins concerning the "Little Father's" fight for life.

At his bedside are his wife, "Comrade Krupskaya," his sister, Maria Ilinichna, and Zinovieff, his foster son.

Lenin is now busy with his ministers working out governmental strategy to be followed for several years, in order that after Lenin's death the remaining Soviet leaders can "carry on" without his advice.

Suggestions for Poultrymen

How to Feed for Eggs

My previous article brought such a ready response from people interested in poultry that I have been urged to write another short spiel for The Mail Tribune.

Poultrymen seem to be most interested in feeding for eggs. At least this is the tenor of the letters I receive. Perhaps it is because feed costs money—real money—and wherever we go in this world those things interest us most that cost the most, generally speaking, anyway.

To begin with, in my humble opinion, based upon years of experience and the opinions of the best commercial poultrymen of the day, the best feed is the cheapest, and not always the best feed is the highest in price! The generally it is.

Take wheat, the basis of all poultry feeds so far as grain is concerned. Puget Sound or coast wheat is a poor feed for poultry, as it is too high in moisture and too low in protein, the very food element that is valuable to poultry. Mid-western wheat, or eastern wheat is far more valuable, though it costs but three or four dollars a ton more to buy for feeding purposes. For flour, well that's different again.

As mentioned in the other issue of this paper, wheat is the most nearly balanced ration for a laying hen, and yet it is far from being a balanced ration so far as eggs are considered. Corn is further off, being high in fat and carbohydrates, heat elements. One hundred pounds of corn will produce 125 whites of eggs and 305 yolks! Anyone can see what would happen if poultry was fed corn only. The fowls would become too fat and the eggs they did lay would contain many double yolks. Remember, poultrymen, that hens which are too fat will not lay well. And too much fattening feeds, starchy foods, such as table scraps and grain (only) have a tendency to bring this about.

In selecting an egg mash I do not advocate one that shows more than 15 or 19 per cent protein, as one that is 20 or 21 per cent is very apt to force your fowls and this will bring on a premature molt alone. In the early months of January or February a condition that should be avoided if you are to obtain the maximum number of eggs during the year. Lighting too heavily during the fall and winter will also bring this about and the two together makes it quite a problem for the average poultry keeper to eliminate from his farm flock. By a premature or partial molt we mean one that comes out of season.

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5 MEN INVOLVED IN BIGGEST MAIL THEFT IN HISTORY

ST. LOUIS, Mo., April 27.—(By the Associated Press)—Federal warrants charging five offenses against five men in connection with the \$2,303,367 mail robbery here April 2, were issued today.

The men named in the warrants are under arrest. They are: William F. Doering, paroled convict, in whose home \$2,139,860 of unsigned federal land bank bonds and \$35,707 of Liberty bonds and coupons, which have been identified as part of the loot, were found; David Weisman of Johnson City, Ill., arrested at the Doering home; William D. Williamson, yardman, arrested at the Doering home; and Ray Renard and Edward Lincham of St. Louis.

The charges against each are: Conspiracy to violate the laws of the United States, maximum prison term two years; entering a mail truck by violence and assaulting a mail messenger, three years; and assault upon a government employee with a deadly weapon for purposes of robbery, 25 years.

Simultaneously with the issuance of the warrants, federal officials announced they also had found in Doering's home \$1,700 of \$20,000 of Liberty bonds stolen in the robbery of the First National bank of Blandville, Ill., September 23, last.

FOREST FIRES RAGE IN EASTERN STATES

WASHINGTON, April 27.—Several thousand acres have been burned over by forest fires starting recently in Prince George and Montgomery counties, Maryland, near the District of Columbia line. The largest fire, starting about three miles from Berwyn, swept a path four miles long and destroyed a residence near that town.

LAKEWOOD, N. J., April 27.—Forest fires which burned over twenty square miles in Ocean county and destroyed property valued at \$250,000, were extinguished early today by 600 volunteers. The First Methodist church and several homes and buildings at Cedar Bridge were destroyed as well as many camps along the Metedeconk river. A man whose identity has not been disclosed is held on suspicion of having set the fire.

Another fire which had destroyed 4000 acres of timberland near Lakehurst was reported under control today.



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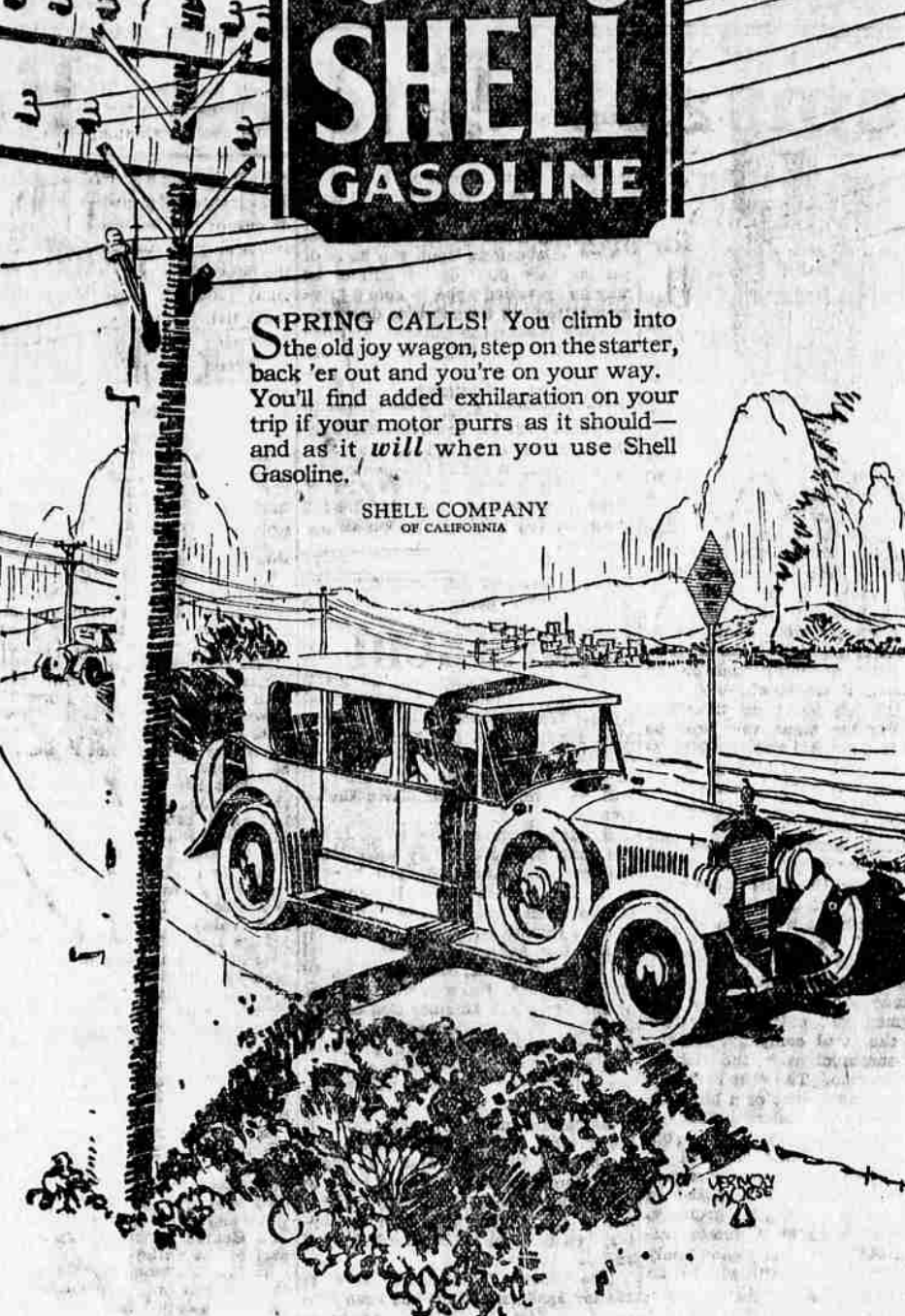
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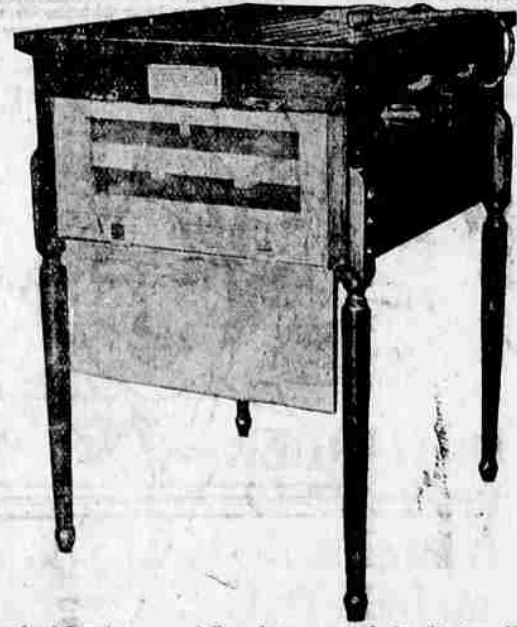
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
