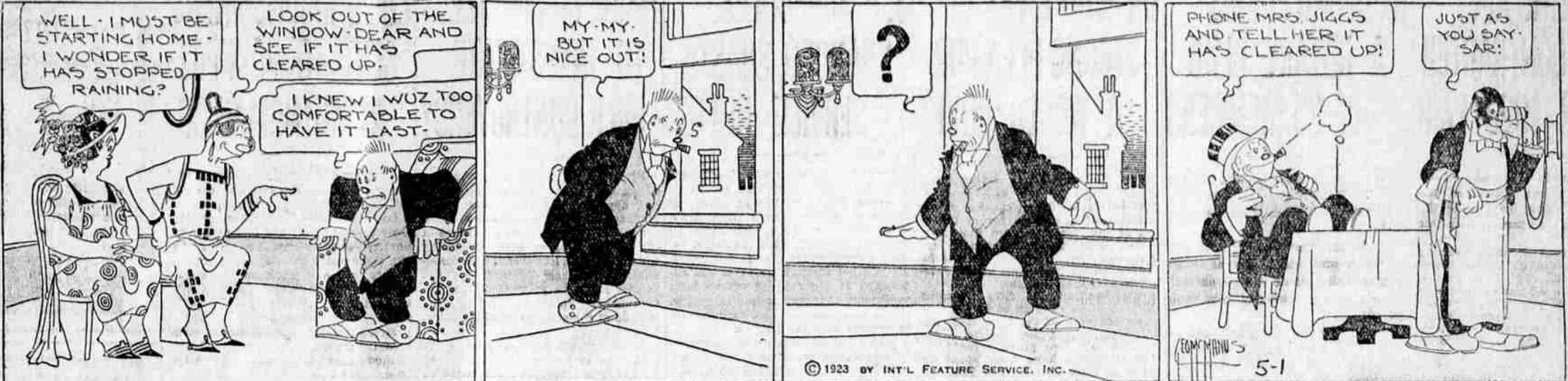

SUGAR BUYING STRIKE GROWING

WASHINGTON, May 1.—President Harding feels that it is wholly consistent for people who have a complaint about prices of a commodity to restrict their consumption of that commodity. It was said at the White House today, in connection with the movement started in various parts of the country to boycott consumption of sugar.

TACOMA, May 1.—Supplementing Mayor Hylan's action in telegraphing President Harding a request that he advocate restriction on the use of sugar, women leaders of the buyers' strike movement to force a drop in the price of the commodity today discussed a proposal that they request the government to name a sugar administrator and that the product be rationed.

The women also outlined plans for a series of meetings.
