1. Application must be made to the recorder prior to the beginning of the erection or alteration of any building.

2. Said applicant must make application showing the number of rooms, use, height, materials, cost, and area of the proposed building, or repairs, together with a sketch of the proposed location on the lot.

3. Instead of waiting for the action of the council, Mr. Davis is given authority to inspect the proposed buildings and alterations and issue permits immediately, provided same comply with the fire, building, and zoning ordinances.
