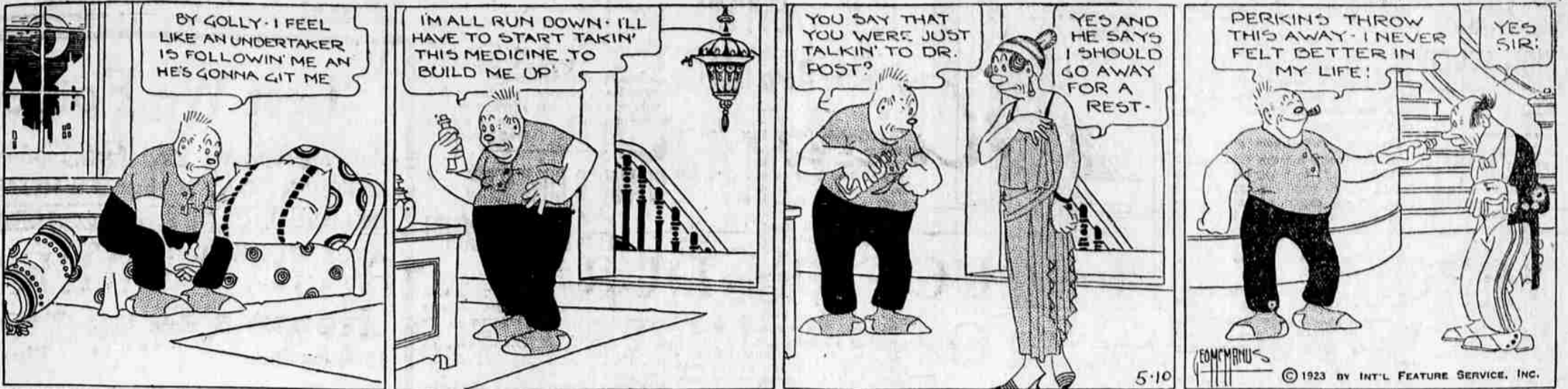

DEPORT BROTHER CHANCELLOR WIRTH FROM RHINE AREA

KARLSRUHE, May 10.—Chief Railway Inspector Wirth, a member of the Badenese diet and brother of the former German chancellor, has been ordered to leave the occupied area, according to advices from Alsey.

BERLIN, May 10.—(By the Associated Press.)—The German government has sent a note to the powers having part in the Ruhr occupation protesting against the Verden court martial which resulted in the conviction of Dr. Krupp von Bohlen and other Krupp officials.

The note accuses the French of making the blowing of the sirens the basis of "a senseless charge that a secret plot was being engineered against the French troops with the object of shifting responsibility for the murder of fourteen workers to the Germans."

As a protest against the sentences of the Verden court martial, the Essen local trade unions committee has appealed for a complete cessation of work tomorrow, requesting that shops and restaurants close and that all street traffic be suspended.

BERLIN, May 10.—(By Associated Press.) A telegram from Saint Gair, Rhenish-Prussia, says that a train operated by the French plunged into the Rhine and that 29 bodies have so far been recovered from the water. The report is based on the statements of travelers arriving at Saint Gair. Saint Gair is near Bacharach.

NEW YORK BANKER KILLED IN PARIS

PARIS, May 10.—(By the Associated Press.)—James M. Parmelee of New York, cashier of the Paris branch of the Guaranty Trust company, was shot dead as he was walking home through one of the principal streets last night. The body was taken to a police station and an autopsy was ordered in an endeavor to ascertain if the bullet that killed the cashier came from a police revolver or was fired by a member of a gang battling with a detective a short distance away.
