IRISH RADICAL RELEASED, BUT ARRESTED AGAIN

LONDON, May 15.—(By the Associated Press)—The court of appeals today ordered the release of Art O'Brien, who was deported to Ireland after being arrested in the March roundup of republican sympathizers. O'Brien was brought before the court on a writ of habeas corpus. Upon his discharge by the court O'Brien immediately was taken into custody by officers from Scotland Yard and was removed to Bow street.

In the Bow street police court, where O'Brien was charged with seditious conspiracy, the case was adjourned for a week. The court refused to liberate O'Brien under bail. He was charged specifically with conspiring with others who are members of the Self-Determination league to disturb the peace in both England and Ireland and to overthrow the government of the Irish free state.

The case of Art O'Brien, involving the status of the hundred or more Irish agitators deported to Ireland after the March roundup in England and Scotland, has attracted wide attention in Great Britain. The situation is of interest to the

government because of the fact that the habeas corpus act of 1870, under which Art O'Brien was released, provides that no resident of England may be deported as a prisoner and declares that persons responsible for violation of the terms of the act may be heavily penalized.

The March deportations were by order of Home Secretary Bridgman, and the government now finds itself faced with the necessity of passing an indemnity act to protect the secretary and other officials who acted under him.

FORMER GOVERNOR BURKE EXONERATED

NEW YORK, May 15.—John Burke, former governor of North Dakota and former treasurer of the United States, was absolved from all responsibility for the failure of the stock brokerage firm of Karols and Burke, of which he was a partner, in a statement issued yesterday by David W. Kahn, counsel for the trustee in bankruptcy of the company.

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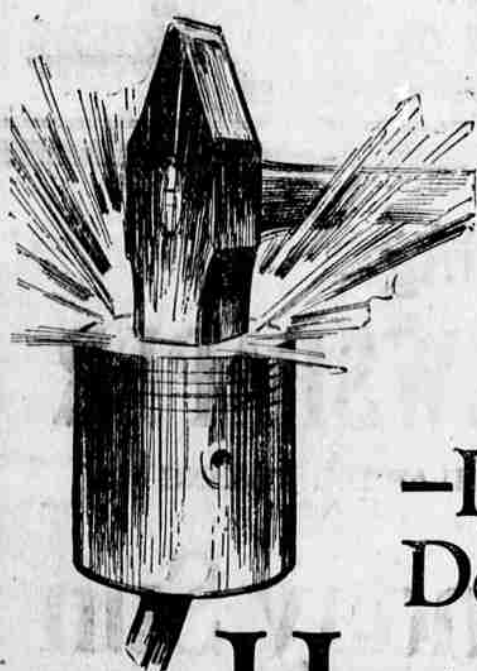
