## ASK BETTER FILMS FOR WASHINGTON

SEATTLE, May 17.—Resolutions formulating a state wide movement for the encouragement of better motion picture films were ready for presentation today at the annual convention here of the Washington state branch, national congress of Mothers and Parent-Teacher associations. The resolutions, prepared by the Seattle Parent-Teacher council, urged establishment of a film library, "that will serve all groups and communities in their selection of films; and co-operation with manufacturers in efforts to improve the standard of screen productions."

More than 850 delegates to the convention had registered up to noon today and more were expected to arrive during the afternoon. The convention closes with the election of officers tomorrow.

Speakers today included John H. Lyons, supervisor of music in the Tacoma public schools; Miss Maud Wilson of the Washington State college extension service and Dr. E. O. Holland, president of Washington State college. Balloting for the nomination of officers proceeded during the day.

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## MURDERERS OF SPOKANE SHERIFF CAUGHT IN IOWA

DES MOINES, Iowa, May 16.—Fred Fletcher and Jack Haines, arrested here early today by the police after a sensational chase in automobiles, are sought in Spokane, Wash., in connection with the slaying of a deputy sheriff, Chief of Detectives Tom Pettit, of the local police force, announced this afternoon. He said the men are known on the coast as Thomas Walton and George P. Burt.

SPOKANE, May 16.—Thomas Walton and George P. Burt, arrested today in Des Moines, Iowa, are wanted here in connection with the shooting recently of Deputy Sheriff Dick Cashatt, who was wounded after he had arrested Walton. Police here also declared that the men have been identified as escaped convicts from San Quentin penitentiary, California, where they were serving sentences for murder.

Deputy Sheriff Cashatt is recovering from Walton's bullet. He arrested Walton three weeks ago after Miss Gladys Homer, whom he had taken for a ride, had become frightened and jumped from his automobile, fracturing her skull. She is still in a dangerous condition, it was said today.

After Walton had fled with Haines in another automobile, police here announced that they discovered both machines, together with a quantity of goods found in the one Walton abandoned, had been stolen here.

## 2 ARE DROWNED IN FLOODS NEAR LITTLE ROCK, ARK.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., May 16.—Two persons drowned made up the known death toll today of the floods which followed the torrential rain storm which overspread Arkansas Monday night, causing a number of small streams to overflow and spread over farm lands with resultant damage.

Near Heber Springs, Dave Hooten, a farmer, was drowned and a negro lost his life near Graysona.

While several small streams have reached the highest stages on record, according to unofficial reports, the general situation was not regarded as serious as in the previous "flood" years.

## PROBATE WILL OF TUT'S DISCOVERER

LONDON, May 17.—(By Associated Press). The Earl of Carnarvon, discoverer of the tomb of King Tutankhamun left an estate of £3398,927, it developed when his will was up for probate today. He bequeathed his race horses and his personal estate to

his wife. This includes his collection of Egyptian treasures, regarding which the only stipulation is that if she decides to sell it the British museum be given the first refusal for £20,000 and the Metropolitan museum of New York the next chance.

Among bequests to friends and relatives is a gift of £500 to Howard Carter, American associate of Larnarvon in the Tutankhamun discoveries.
