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'U' PRESIDENT OFFERS \$10,000 FOR INFORMATION

CHICAGO, May 16.—A reward of \$10,000 was offered today by the trustees of Northwestern university at the request of Dr. Walter Dill Scott, president of the institution, for definite information that would clear up the mystery surrounding the disappearance of Leighton Mount, a freshman who disappeared in September, 1921, after a class rush.

CHICAGO, May 16.—(By Associated Press). Eight hundred students of Northwestern university at a chapel meeting called by the student council today adopted unanimously a resolution of unqualified support of, and confidence in President Walter Dill Scott, and expressing disapproval of methods of investigation of the disappearance of Leighton Mount, a freshman, in 1921.

The resolution was drawn up by the student council and presented by James Patterson. In a short address Patterson declared the administration officers and the student body were being "maligned, lied about and severely censured," when beyond all doubt, all that the university sought was the truth in the case and that an effort was being made to make President Scott a victim.
