

CHANCE CAPTURE NETS BOOTLEGGER

YAKIMA, Wash., May 18.—Earl Redlinger, upon pleading guilty to the possession of liquor on the Indian reservation before Judge J. Stanley Webster in federal court today, was fined \$500. Redlinger was arrested by the prosecuting attorney and a deputy sheriff in January, when they stopped their car to aid a motorist whose machine seemed stalled by the side of the road.

Redlinger was round asleep in the car, which also contained 20 gallons of alleged high power whiskey.

JUDGE DISQUALIFIED IN FLOGGING CASE

CROSS CITY, Fla., May 18.—Trial of Walter Higginbotham, charged with first degree murder growing out of the death of Martin Tabert of North Dakota in a convict labor camp, was halted today when the defense filed affidavits from two citizens accusing Judge Mallory Horne, presiding jurist, of being prejudiced against the defendant. Judge Horne, disqualified himself and recessed the hearing until Governor Hardee could name a new judge.

TIEN TSIN, May 18.—(By Associated Press). Day and night the Suchow bandits are marching their weary captives over the mountains back of Lin-cheng, according to advices received here today.

The bandits again have sent word to the relief parties at Lin-cheng that the Chinese troops still are menacing them and have not been withdrawn, as promised.

"The bandits are not fools," said Marcel Berube, who was sent out with the message on a brief parole, and they will refuse to negotiate for our release until the troops are called off."
