

LITTLE TOT VICTIM TRAGIC ACCIDENT WHEN BOILER FALLS

A tragic accident, in which little Ethel Marie Dally, two year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Dally of Medford, lost her life occurred Thursday morning about seven o'clock.

The child's mother was washing and a boiler full of scalding water was sitting on the stove near which the child was standing. The mother, in moving the boiler to put more wood in the stove, overbalanced it and the scalding water fell on the infant.

The victim of the accident was taken to the Sacred Heart Hospital and every possible effort was made to save her life, but to no avail. The end came yesterday afternoon about three o'clock.

Mr. and Mrs. Harry Dally and their remaining child, Charles D. Dally, four years old, live in a tent house in the Queen Anne addition to Medford near the end of East Jackson street. They recently purchased three lots there, intending to make the place their permanent home.

The funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at the Perle Funeral home with Rev. F. R. Leach officiating. Interment will be in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

FIRST LEGAL STEP FOR DOC COOK

FORT WORTH, Texas, May 18.—Preliminary motions in the mail fraud cases against Dr. Frederick Cook and others connected with the promotions of the petroleum producers' association were argued today before Federal Judge Benjamin F. Bledsoe.

Dr. Cook and 13 others pleaded not guilty when arraigned yesterday in the Bledsoe Oil company case, in which Judge Bledsoe overruled all motions. However, he granted a bill of particulars as to certain defendants, under which ruling the government is required to file a specification of charges against those defendants.

BRITISH SUBJECTS TOLD BY SOVIET TO LEAVE QUICK

MOSCOW, May 18.—(By the Associated Press.)—Although the British mission states that no official instructions to leave Moscow had reached it up to noon today, a number of British subjects have been asked by the mission to be prepared to leave on short notice.

MOSCOW, May 18.—(By the Associated Press.)—A Russian soviet note sent by Foreign Minister Tchitcherin to the Swiss government today holds that government responsible for the recent assassination at Lausanne of M. Vorovsky, a soviet representative there, through the negligence of Swiss officials to guard him. The Tchitcherin note asks an investigation of the circumstances of the crime, the dismissal of the employees in charge and a prompt, speedy trial of the assassins.

The note also protests the refusal of the Swiss to grant diplomatic courier privileges to the Russian delegation at Lausanne.

COLUMBIA GEORGE MAY GO FREE

PORTLAND, Ore., May 18.—Columbia George, Umatilla Indian, 83, who has served half of a twenty year sentence at Leavenworth following his conviction of killing Timot, another Umatilla, may be released to spend his remaining years among his people if recommendations of Robert R. Rankin, assistant district attorney here in 1913, when the Indian was convicted, are favorably acted upon. Rankin today joined J. H. Raley, attorney for Columbia George in the effort to obtain the Indian's freedom. The application for pardon sets forth that the conviction was obtained on circumstantial evidence and that Columbia George to this day asserts his innocence.
