BRYAN SUFFERS ANOTHER DEFEAT

INDIANAPOLIS, May 18.—With the work of electing a moderator out of the way, the general assembly of the Presbyterian church in the United States, in session here will get down to other business today.

At this afternoon's session, the Rev. Lewis Mudge, the stated clerk, will report on overtures sent down to the presbyteries by the general assembly.

Dr. Charles F. Wishart, president of Wooster college, Wooster, Ohio, was elected moderator at yesterday's session after a spirited race with William Jennings Bryan.

Capacity Increased At Lumber Mill

Work has been completed at the Brownlee-Olds Lumber company which enabled them to start the second side of the mill on Thursday. This not only increased the number of employees, but greatly increases the production of lumber, both sides of the mill having a capacity of from 100,000 to 125,000 feet per day.

The logging camps are supplying plenty of logs, the big pond at the mill being well filled.

YOUNG WIFE FREED BY KLAMATH JURY

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., May 18.—Mrs. Mabel Nichols, 23 year old wife of W. F. Nichols of Ellensburg, Wash., was acquitted late yesterday by a jury which deliberated forty-five minutes on evidence adduced at her trial for the killing last December at Summit stage station of Robert Greer, who she alleged induced her to desert her husband and five-year-old daughter.

Earlier yesterday Mrs. Nichols on the stand told of being abducted from her home by Greer and taken to Bend, Ore., and later to the stage station in Klamath county, where she shot him in a quarrel when he declared he would force her into a night life.

HALF SALVATION ARMY QUOTA IS COLLECTED

Mr. Hull of the Modoc was up to W. C. Chapman's Saturday.

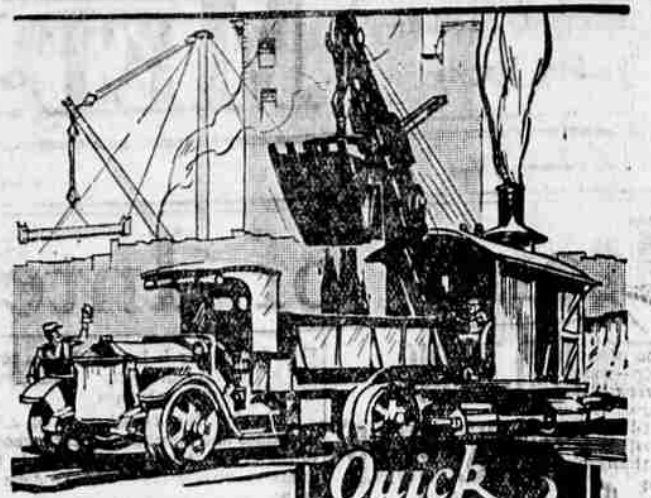
Seven young men have taken up homesteads on the upper Evans creek district this winter and spring.

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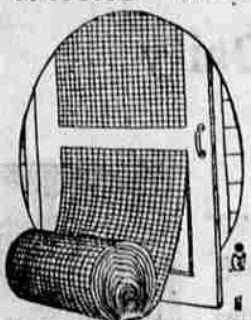
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MAYORS CLEAN-UP PROCLAMATION
