

DEMOCRATS MAY GET INCREASE IN CONG. COMMITTEE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—(By the Associated Press)—Increased representation of democrats on committees in the new house of representatives is forecast as a result of the reduced republican majority in the house from 170 to 166. In the last congress the republicans fixed the ratio at two majority members to one of the minority, but the democrats claim and the republican leaders appear inclined to concede that there should be a re-apportionment.

In the 65th congress in which the democrats had a plurality of two, the ratio was 12 to 5, and the democratic leaders are expected to ask for the same division in this congress.

The republicans, particularly, if they have to make concessions to the progressives in their party in making their committee assignments, probably will insist, however, on the 13 to 2 ratio.

The number of places on each committee which is to be allotted to the majority and the minority will be decided at a conference of the majority members of the house, which, under present plans, will be held on December 3, two days before the convening of congress. Assignments of the republican members to committees then will be made by the committee on committees which will consist of one republican from each state with republican representation.

The selections for this committee will be made by each state delegation in advance of the party conference.

Secy. Work Starts Drive To Help Silver Miners

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29.—Because of the decrease in the demand for silver for monetary purposes, Secretary Work has ordered the bureau of mines to institute a survey to determine new uses for the metal in commerce and industry. The expiration of the Pittman act, he declared, has left silver producers facing the necessity of finding new markets and he indicated that if a preliminary study indicated helpful results definite research work would be undertaken.
