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ALASKA VOTE IS IN FAVOR NEW STATE CONVENTION

KETCHIKAN, Alaska, Nov. 8.—A convention to follow one of the last suggestions of the late President Harding by moving for formation of southeastern Alaska into a state today was assured.

Leaders of the movement, which originated in this city following a tour of Alaska last summer by Mr. Harding predicted today that the convention would invite Cordova, ocean terminus of the Copper River and Northwestern railway and the Copper river valley to join southeastern Alaska in a petition to congress for division of Alaska into two territories.

Returns from an election held Tuesday in eight communities of pan handle of Alaska, the narrow strip of American area lying between British Columbia and the Pacific ocean, strongly favored calling a convention which is to be held at Juneau, the capital of the territory, next Thursday. The vote in Juneau, Douglas, Skagway, Petersburg, Wrangell and Ketchikan was 264 for division of the territory and 89 against. From all other communities the people were unanimously for division. Returns have not been received from Sitka.

Argument for formation of a state consisting of the panhandle and adjacent area is that at present 90 per cent of the population and development resources are in southeastern Alaska, and that this part of the territory is taxed for development of the interior. Advocates of division hope that after it has been effected, congress will admit the new territory as a state.

PAGE FILM GRIPS THROWS WITH BIGNESS

"Enemies of Women," which is at the Page theater this week, is a big picture, a great picture, with something more behind it than the mere necessity for filling a screen. It was bound to have more in it than the ordinary program picture because it is made from one of Vincente Blasec Ibáñez's novels, and Ibáñez always has something to say.

The scene shifts from Petrograd to Paris; thence to Monte Carlo, the story being shunted from one to the other of these points as the narrative demands. The bigness of the canvas requires such wide scope in the locale. There is grandeur in the sweep of the story; magnificence in the execution of the picture; splendor in much of the acting, with Lionel Barrymore once again proving his mastery of pantomime; his power, his virility. The scene of his duel with the Cossack in which both men, bared to the waist, fight in the snow at the foot of the steps to Prince Lubimoff's palace, with a throng of shivering, covering, terrified women looking on is as dramatic as anything ever shown on the screen.

Barrymore's Lubimoff is an impersonation as big as the story; cold at first as the land from which he comes, gradually thawing under the influence of a love he tries to resist, but which gets him, and finally warmed into a glow of pity for suffering humanity and stirred by his depths by the patriotism of those around him.

Alma Rubens, who stars with Barrymore in the picture, is a tragic figure as Alicia, Duchess de Lille, wayward, vain, selfish, proud, until the tragedy of the war touches her heart, in the supposed death of her son, and then all woman; gentle, tender, lovely.
