

C. C. CATE RESIGNS TO TAKE EFFECT FIRST OF YEAR

With widespread and universal regret the citizens of Jackson county will receive the announcement of the resignation of Claude C. Cate as county pathologist and county agent. To many of the people this will come as a distinct surprise, but a few of his more intimate associates have known for some time that he was meditating this action.

Mr. Cate makes the announcement with as much regret as it will be received by his friends, but says he finds it incumbent upon himself to take this action on account of his health and his own pressing personal affairs. The position of county pathologist of Jackson county is an exacting one and the demands made upon the incumbent are strenuous in the extreme.

Mr. Cate, or Claude as he is more familiarly known, has tremendous capacity for work. In all the years that he has so faithfully served the public he has seldom given thought to himself and has sacrificed everything to the performance of his duty as he saw it. The unremitting and close attention to his work has taken its toll until he finds himself where he can but heed the warnings and ease up.

Mr. Cate came to assume the office in December, 1915. When he arrived he entered into a position of the most difficult kind. The growers of this community demanded only a man of the highest order; they had preconceived ideas of what he should be; they wanted a man who would stand out pre-eminently above the average; they demanded a man who could solve their riddles and drag their bodies out of their troubles. Such a man they were bound to have or they would none. It was well Mr. Cate has met his obligations, all know.

Mr. Cate's work has been too varied and extensive to permit of even a small amount of it being mentioned here. His work in the control of pests, the better understanding and care in the elimination of blight, his work on precooling and refrigeration, his experiment in the cats for the ripening and time of picking of fruits, his able work in heading the corps of inspectors, and his marvelous store of knowledge of local conditions are all too well known to need mention.

All through the state and the whole country Cate's reputation stands out. Often has it been heard of other counties making their demands in the words: "What we need to put us on one foot is a Cate."

Not only in his work has he met with the approval of the public but, with his pleasing personality he has made friends everywhere.

C. C. Cate has shown his faith in the valley by the purchase of his orchard, and he promises that he will again return when he has rested up and will take his place as a fruit grower here. Local ranchers are unanimous in hearty thanks for past services and wish for Mr. Cate's future success.

Mr. Cate hopes to leave by January first. No information regarding his probable successor has been given out.

INCOME TAX TO CREATE JOBS FOR MANY DEMOCRATS

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 13.—Although the Salem electorate voted adversely to the state income tax law at the special election held here last Tuesday, this city, more than any other municipality in Oregon, probably will profit as a result of the success of the measure.

Under the provisions of the law the collection of the tax is vested in the state tax commissioner. This means that the collection headquarters probably will be located in Salem, either under the act offices for the enforcement of the law may be established in any part of the state. Officials agreed today that between 40 and 60 clerks, stenographers, investigators, and other employees will be added to the state payroll as a result of the approval of the law by the voters.

Many Jobs to be Created
Based upon the number of employees in the income tax collecting department of the federal internal revenue offices in Portland, Earl Fisher, state tax commissioner, has estimated that not less than 40 positions will be made available in his division of the state government as soon as the work of collecting the tax gets under way.

The annual cost of these employees, based on an average of \$1800, will total \$62,000. In some instances the more important employees of the department probably will command more than \$2000 a year, which will increase the annual payroll to \$65,000.

Because of the crowded condition of the state buildings, it probably will be necessary to transfer the tax commissioner's offices for the present crowded quarters on the second floor of the capitol structure to the downtown district. Rentals for the rooms required in handling the income tax collections would exceed \$150 a month or in the neighborhood of \$2000 a year. Should a branch office be located in Portland, the rental would be increased materially.

Cost Placed at \$350,000
The state also will be required to make a large expenditure in the purchase of office equipment. Mr. Fisher has estimated that he will handle approximately 70,000 income tax returns a year, and under the law these reports must be retained for a period of three years. This would mean that cabinets must be provided to care for approximately 210,000 of these reports at one time.

Printing of the forms for the department also will be a large item of expense, as will the cost of mailing out the reports. The total cost of conducting the department was estimated today at from \$100,000 to \$150,000 a year.

At the next session of the legislature a memorial will be presented urging the federal government to grant states having income tax laws authority to examine the records of the federal income tax department. At the present time this is not permissible, officials said.

Approval of the income tax law by the voters also means that the working force in the offices of the state treasurer will be increased, according to Frank Sever, chief deputy. Mr. Sever, a week ago estimated that it could be necessary to add one more employ to his present force in case the income tax law was approved, but today he intimated that the services of two or three persons would be required to carry on the work.

Law in Effect at Once
The law goes into effect immediately, and the persons affected by the act will be required to file their income reports with the state tax commissioner before March 15, 1924. For failure to comply with the provisions of the law a person may be sent to the penitentiary.

Payments of the state income tax law may be made in four installments. Mr. Fisher has made no attempt to estimate the amount of money that will be raised through the operation of the law, although other officials have said that it will return to the state between \$750,000 and \$1,000,000.

SUN YET SEN IS IN ASCENDANCY AGAIN

SHANGHAI, Nov. 13.—(By Associated Press.) Sun Yat Sen, the Chinese leader has been captured at Whakow, which has been held by north Chinese forces in Kwang Tung province under General Chen Chung Ming, according to a dispatch received at Canton. Sun's stronghold, unofficially received here state.

Announcement of the seizure states: "An airplane dispatch has just arrived here announcing the capture of Whakow. Sun Yat Sen has forced the enemy to retreat toward the East river over Shiklung. When the troops defending Whakow began pursuing the retreating forces, Sun Yat Sen's right wing marched in and captured the city."

The advice received here indicate that the crisis which threatened last week when Sun's troops were reported to be surrounded at Shiklung by General Chen's army, has been averted, temporarily, at least.

NO DEVELOPMENTS IN HOLDUP CASE

It is expected that the hearing of the evidence in the train robbery will be among the last matters taken up by the present session of the grand jury.
