"THIS IS THAT" TO BE SUBJECT OF SERMON TONIGHT

Afternoon services with the theme, "The Victorious Christian Life," began this afternoon at 2:30 and will be held also tomorrow and Friday. One will find rich blessing to his spiritual life by being present with his bible and the spirit of prayer. Every one is welcome. As these discussions are not denominational in any sense.

HIGH SCHOOL TO USE NEW ARMORY FOR GYMNASIUM

At the meeting of the school board last night that body decided to use the new armory for the gymnasium work and indoor athletics of the high school, a step which the board has had in contemplation for some time past, the move having been precipitated by the fact that the Natatorium management no longer cared to have their building used for this purpose, as in years past. This means that all the basket ball games will be played in the armory.

The board has concluded leasing arrangements with the National Guard officers' board, which has charge of the armory. Because of the armory having been leased permanently on certain days and nights to other organizations for other purposes, the high school's gymnastic and athletic program must conform to these other leases. Hence the high school plan must await the completion of final arrangements before being put into effect.

A committee was present at last night's school board meeting to request that another school room be finished in the Roosevelt building and put into use. However, no action was taken by the board on this request. All board members were present with the exception of J. C. Mann.

Japan Budget Reduced.
TOKIO, Nov. 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—The cabinet's estimate for the ordinary budget for the year 1924, is 1,270,000,000 yen, the equivalent of approximately \$635,000,000 in American money.

This estimate is a reduction of 104,000,000 yen under the current year's figures. The cabinet has further decided to reduce the proposed expenditures for the remainder of the current year by 107,000,000 yen.

PAT MEGO BURIED IN NEW ORLEANS BY MASONIC LODGE

Pat Mego, former well known Medford policeman, who died suddenly at New Orleans last week, was buried last Tuesday, under the auspices of the Masonic lodge, of which he had been a member for the last two years. This information was received by the local K. of P. lodge in a letter.

There were few more interesting characters than Pat Mego, and he hid beneath a rough exterior a heart of gold, characterized by a genial good nature and kindheartedness to the extreme. As a boy he went to sea, and joined the navy. He was one of the survivors of the Alpha disaster, and served in the Philippines. He led an adventurous life, and had an inexhaustible fund of stories from his experiences. The one that he never tired of telling, was the time a desperado, trapped in a shanty on the San Francisco waterfront, opened fire, one bullet passing through Pat's hat. He had also been a member of the San Francisco fire department.

A gold watch he had carried for years has not been located, and it is presumed that it was left in a jewelry store for repairs.

Efforts are also being made by the Knights of Pythias lodge to locate a sister and son.

Greek Official Dies in N. Y.
NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Lambros Coronilas, former Greek minister to the United States and later finance minister under President Venizelos, died at the Hotel Seville, last night. It was announced today. He was about 70 years old and had been in ill health for some time.

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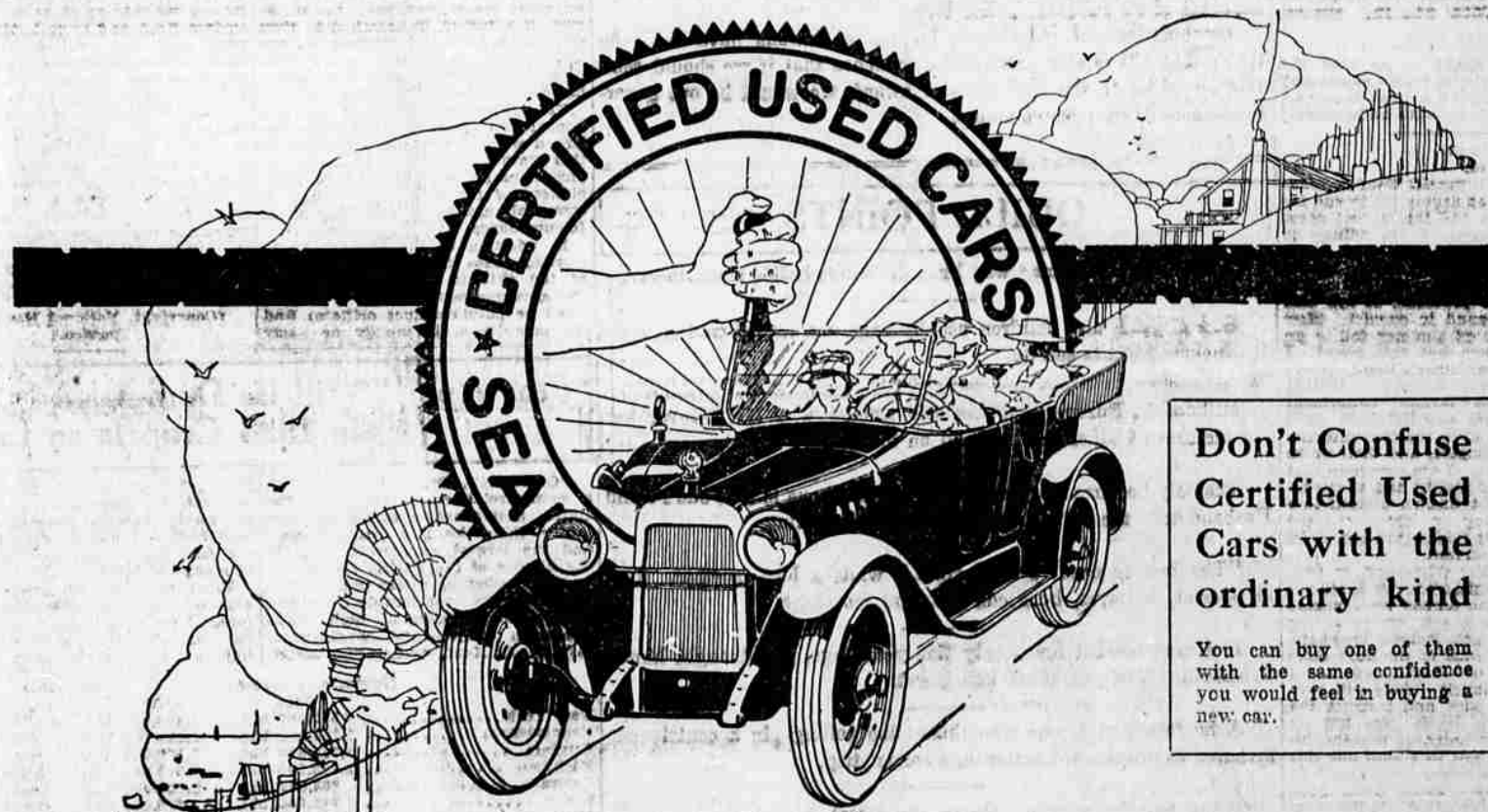
