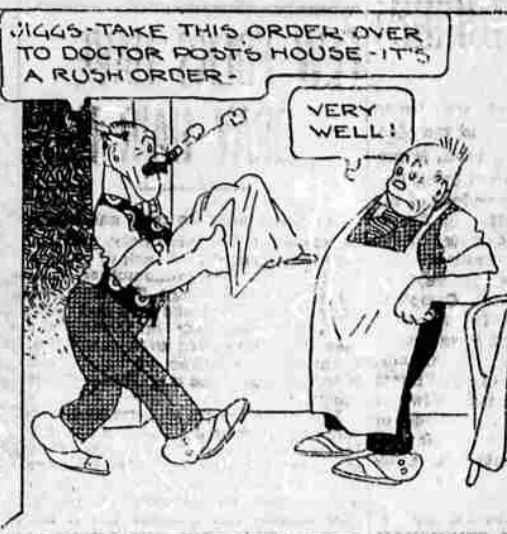

MOTHER LEARNS OF HER HUSBAND'S FATE; INSISTS ON VISIT

LODI, Cal., Nov. 14.—Mrs. Alex A. Kels left her home here today to visit her husband in Folsom prison where he is awaiting execution January 4, for the murder of Ed Meservy, aged laborer.

Mrs. Kels, although on the verge of a nervous breakdown, completed all arrangements yesterday to meet her husband for the first time since September 12, the murder date. Up to last Saturday, Mrs. Kels had been kept in ignorance of the fact that Kels himself was the murderer, as she was an expectant mother when the crime was committed.

Friends and relatives tried to dissuade Mrs. Kels from taking the trip. She was accompanied by Kels' sister, Mrs. E. C. Staples.

BANDON ASTROLOGER WANTS BOOKS TO SEE IF HE IS TO HANG

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 14.—Arthur Covell, crippled astrologer, sentenced to hang for complicity in the murder of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Ebba Covell of Bandon, arrived at the state penitentiary here about 6:30 o'clock this morning and was immediately installed in the hospital ward where he will await execution of the sentence pronounced upon him yesterday afternoon by Circuit Judge Kendall of the Coos county circuit court.

Up to ten o'clock this morning Covell had made no statement whatever to the prison authorities, but Deputy Sheriff Malehora of Coos county, said that his prisoner en route to Salem expressed the hope that his astrology books would be returned to him that he might find out whether he actually is to hang on December 21, the date set by Judge Kendall.

Deputy Warden Lillis, in charge of prisoners at the penitentiary, said that he did not think the books would be returned to Covell. He said that the cripple appeared to take his sentence calmly and showed no visible evidence of being downcast.
