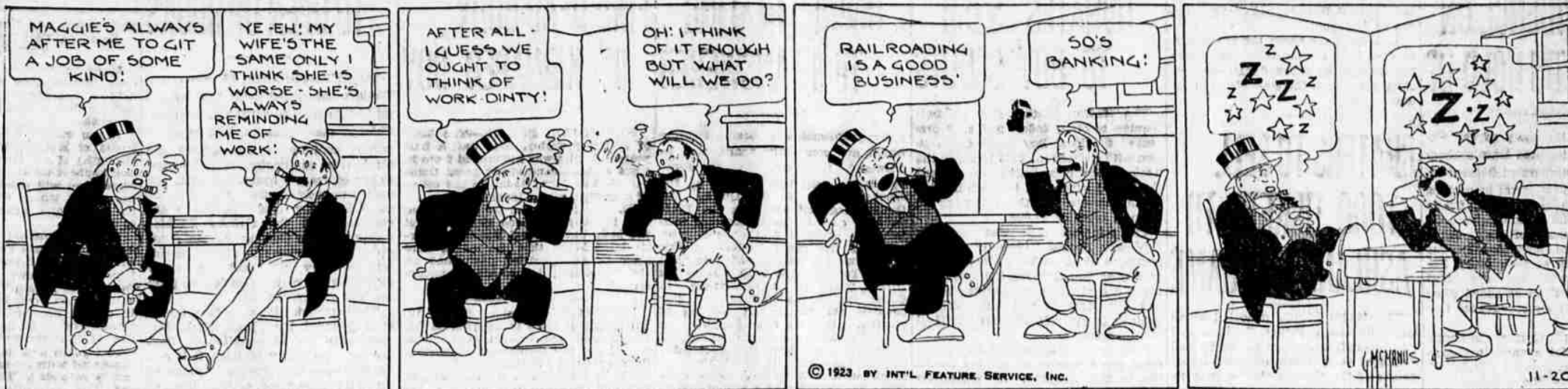

Wire Report On Foreign Money

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—Overnight cable dispatches confirming the reported agreement between the allies, which at least postpones a break between France and England over German policies, influenced another sharp rally in foreign bills at the opening of today's foreign exchange market.
 Demand sterling again touched \$4.336, more than three cents above yesterday's final quotation.
 Most of the continental exchange also moved upward, Holland guilders displaying particular strength at 37.75 cents, a gain of 18 points over yesterday. French francs improved 6½ points to 5.39 cents.
