**COPCO COMPANY ASKS REDUCTION IN TAX RAISE**

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 21.—The California-Oregon Power company, with headquarters in Medford, has filed with the tax commission here notice of appeal to the circuit court for Jackson county in an effort to obtain a substantial reduction in the assessed valuation of its properties in this state. The valuations of these properties were fixed by the state tax commission, and were approved by the state board of equalization which met here last month.

The commission placed a valuation of \$2,125,237 on the properties of the utility. Last year the valuation was fixed at \$1,248,937. The company requests a reduction of its valuations to \$1,825,716.

It was reported today that a number of other utilities have proposed to institute suits in the courts to denounce the reasonableness of the valuations placed upon their properties.

In event the taxes of the utilities are increased materially, based on the levy for 1924, relief will be asked at the hands of the public service commission. In other words the utilities affected will petition the public service commission for increased rates, which will mean that any added burden will revert back to the consumers.

**ARMY NAVY GAME**  
 TICKETS SOLD OUT,  
 100,000 LOSE OUT

NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—One hundred thousand mailed applications for seats at the Polo grounds Saturday when the Army and Navy hold their

annual gridiron classic have been returned by the New York National league baseball club, operators of the park, because all seats were sold. Twenty-nine thousand tickets were received each by the Army and Navy for distribution and the operating company retained the remaining 7000 which it sold to patrons of the baseball club. Virtually all hotel accommodations and theater tickets for the week end have been taken in addition to reservations at the after-theater cabarets and midnight rendezvous. Both teams went thru stiff practice sessions yesterday, the army when at West Point, doing the latter part of their work by the glare of arc lights and punting with the aid of huge searchlights.

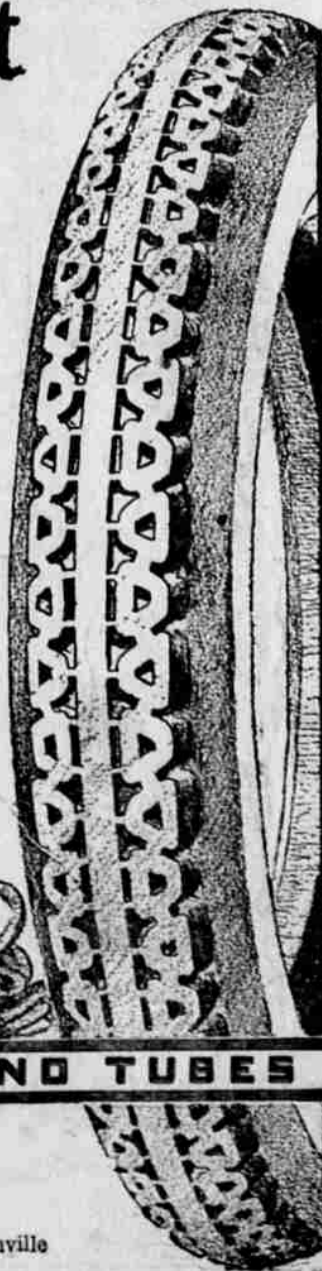
