O. A. C.-OREGON RACE TO PRECEDE FOOTBALL GAME

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 23.—Oregon's annual home coming cross country meet next Saturday will be a three-cornered affair with Idaho long distance runners competing against the University of Oregon and Oregon Agricultural college five men teams. Coach Hayward held tryouts last night over the long course. Keating, Tetz, Robson, McCall and Muller finished in the order named and will represent Oregon Saturday. Robson is the only veteran.

Both the Aggies and Idaho have veteran teams. The run starts prior to the University of Oregon-O. A. C. game of football and finishes about game time. Personnel of the invading teams will be: Idaho, Penwell, Hillman, Crowe, Sowder and Wynan; the Aggie coach will select his five runners from Walker, Graves, Daniels, Barthol, Mason, Butts and Keith.

W. & J. Player Injured
WASHINGTON, Pa., Nov. 23.—Football days are over for Al Crook, Washington and Jefferson center, it developed today when an X-ray examination showed that he had sustained a crushed vertebrae of his neck in the game with Detroit, his home city, on October 27. He will be forced to wear a plaster cast for at least six months. Crook participated in the Lafayette, Wayneburg and Pitt games after receiving the injury, but collapsed last Saturday after the Pitt-Washington and Jefferson battle, and the discovery of the extent of his injury followed.

Hornby to Chicago Cubs
CHICAGO, Nov. 23.—Rogers Hornby, second baseman of the St. Louis Nationals and William "Kid" Gleason, late pilot of the Chicago Americans, will become members of the Chicago Nationals by the terms of a deal which will shortly be closed according to today's Chicago Tribune.

Hack Miller, Harry Callahan, Charlie Hollocher, Virgil Cheeves and Ernie Osborne and about \$100,000 will go to the Cardinals in the trade, according to the Tribune which says that Manager Branch Rickey of the Cards will affix his official approval of the deal today.

Idaho and U. S. C. Ready
LOS ANGELES, Nov. 23.—With practice games concluded and announcements from both coaches they were satisfied with the showing of their teams, the University of Southern California's Trojans and the Vandals of the University of Idaho are ready for the gridiron battle tomorrow at the Coliseum here.

As his varsity men trudged off the field after a stiff two hour drill Coach Henderson of the U. S. C. remarked, "I have no alibis if we lose Saturday to Idaho."

Robert Lee Matthews, Vandal mentor, sent his men thru a light workout at the Rose bowl at Pasadena. There was no attempt at scrimmage under the hot sun, passing and kicking receiving most of their attention.

Washington Is Favorite
SEATTLE, Nov. 23.—When the University of Washington and Washington State college eleven face each other on the gridiron at the stadium here tomorrow afternoon the Huskies will have an edge on their opponents, according to scores made by the two football teams this season.

The Purple and Gold eleven has won two Pacific coast conference contests and lost one. They have also amassed a total of 234 points this season, against 30 points scored by all their opponents this year.

Last year the Washington State eleven lost to the Purple and Gold by a 16 to 13 score.

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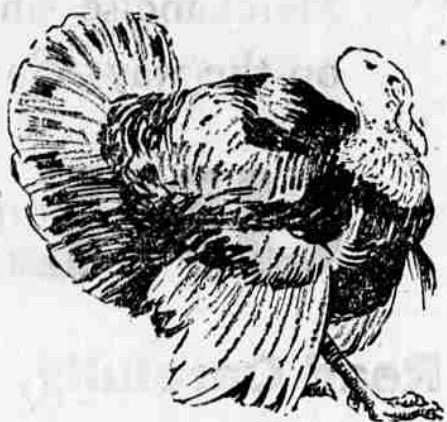

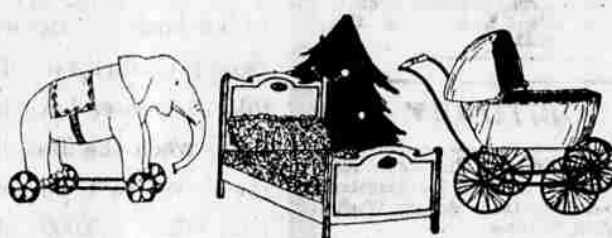
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
