PICKING UP GOLD
IN BOX FACTORY
CHUTE NEAR CITY

"Gold is being picked up in the chute from a long pond to a box factory at Medford and there is considerable speculation as to where the gold is coming from," reports Fred Williams, former member of the state public service commission, at the Hotel Oregon. "The box factory has a pond about 500 feet wide. Into the pond are dumped logs which are brought in over the hills from various parts of the county. As the logs are dragged along they pick up mud occasionally and this mud is rubbed off as the logs are yanked out of the pond up the chute into the sawmill. Men at the mill have gathered around flake gold to fill half a small bottle. The gold undoubtedly comes in mud on the logs, but as the logs come from all directions, no one knows where the gold laden dirt is picked up. Of course, if someone took the time to scrape mud off each log before it was dumped into the pond and examined the deposit, it would be possible to locate the logs carrying the gold, and also to check back where the logs came from. But even so, as the logs are generally dragged a quarter of a mile or more, even if the golden logs were identified it would then require a painstaking search of every foot of the ground over which the logs were dragged before they were placed on the trucks. And no one wants to take that much trouble even to find a gold mine."—Portland Oregonian.
