

TALENT WOMAN INSPIRES MOVE TO PLANT FLOWERS

When Mrs. I. C. Williams of Talent planted petunias in front of her residence on the Pacific Highway, little did she realize that she was planting the seed for a movement in Jackson county to get every property owner on this highway to plant flowers and shrubbery.

The directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce have authorized the appointment of a committee, which will be expected to furnish the leadership and guidance for a constructive movement to beautify the Pacific Highway in Jackson county. The committee will confer with every civic organization in the various counties with a view of having each assume the responsibility of calling upon the owners of property in a certain section and requesting them to plant petunias or perennial shrubs.

The residents of Talent, during the past few years, have clearly demonstrated the value of a concerted effort to plant flowers and every tourist passing there has been impressed with the civic pride of the locality. It is a very good publicity medium and the directors of the Medford Chamber are desirous of extending this method of advertising by getting the entire length of the Pacific Highway in Jackson county planted.

It was the intention of the Fair association to plant their frontage to petunias last year and the plans were offered them by H. B. Nye of Talent, but lack of funds and a late start prevented them from so doing. Provisions have been made for planting the Fair grounds' frontage next year.

"Growers in this section are attempting to solve the puzzle which permits the sale of apples at 10c each in Milwaukee, Wis., while the grower here did not obtain more than 50c for a full box containing approximately 180 apples," says a telegraphic dispatch from Walla Walla, Wash. "This spark of suspicion has been fanned into flame again by the public announcement of a local business man, who, in an affidavit executed before a notary public, swears he purchased in Milwaukee, Wis., apples for which he paid 10c each—apples, the packing of which showed they were shipped by a local concern, and also were of a grade known as 'C' grade, the best thing to eat. Growers and packers assert that 15c to 20c per box would be a big price for this particular grade to the grower this season, but for sake of argument are willing to admit the grower might have received 50c for them under certain circumstances."

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SCRAPPING U. S. BATTLESHIPS TO YIELD A PROFIT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—Work already done at the New York and Philadelphia navy yards on the scrapping of four uncompleted vessels on their ways under the treaty limiting naval armament indicates that the assignment of this task to these yards will yield the government about \$30,000 more than would have been received if the ships had been sold for the highest approved bids made for them by civilian companies.

The work of cutting the South Dakota and Indiana to shipping sizes is progressing more rapidly and with less difficulty in the New York yard at Brooklyn, the navy department announced today, than was anticipated by the experts who figured on the job for various companies. Bids were opened Friday for the remaining six battleships scheduled for sale to be scrapped under the treaty. They included the Michigan, Minnesota and Kansas at the Philadelphia yards; the Vermont and Nebraska at the Mare Island, Cal., yard and Delaware at the Boston yard.

CHICAGO STUDENT SLAIN BY YEGGS POLICE BELIEVE

CHICAGO, Nov. 26.—Twenty-four hours since the body of Freeman Louis Tracy, a student of political economy and a member of the Electrical Workers union, although a well paid technician, was found on a south side street early yesterday with a bullet hole in the head, police still were without a solution of the mystery.

Tracy, 23 years old, until recently a student of political economy at the University of Chicago, still lived in the university district and his body was found near the campus. He had dropped his work at the university for a \$500 a month position with the Commonwealth Edison company in one of its power plants in South Chicago but was said to have been intending saving money for a broader course at a later time.

Although he was said to have been a royal member of the electrical workers' union, the police found nothing to indicate any labor trouble.

They turned to the old theory of jealousy, but nothing in the shape of a clue developed, notwithstanding the correspondence with several young women, one of them a minister's daughter and a married woman whose letters indicated a long platonic friendship, it was said. Detectives finally held the most plausible theory to be that he was picked up by kidnapping bandits and killed when he resisted robbery and his body tossed out of an automobile. His hat was found a few blocks from the spot where the body was found.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Representative Tinkham, republican of Massachusetts, announced he would introduce a resolution at the coming session of congress calling for an investigation of the anti-saloon league by a special house committee.

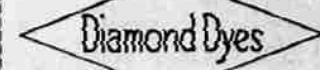
DUCK SUPPER FOR 40-8'S AT LOCAL ARMORY WED. EVE

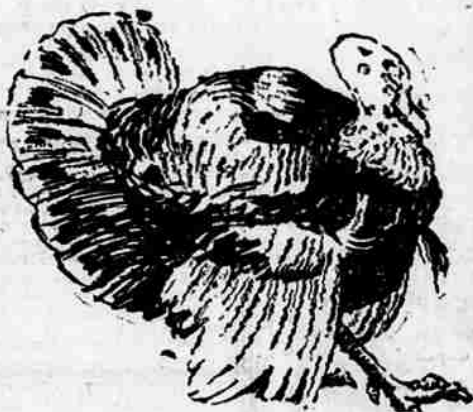
