ROXY ANNE AND TABLE ROCK RDS. ARE LIVE ISSUES

Further consideration has been given by the directors of the Medford Chamber of commerce to the building of two roads that would add to the number of scenic attractions already available. One project calls for a road to the top of Roxy Ann and the other for a road to the top of Table Rock and around its rim.

As the Table Rock project will not require so large an expenditure as the road to Roxy Ann it was deemed advisable that immediate energy be expended on the Table Rock road and when completed it will undoubtedly be less difficult to secure the funds to build the Roxy Ann road as the residents of the valley will realize the value of such scenic drives. Alex Sparrow heads the committee which is to investigate the feasibility and cost of the proposed Table Rock road. Another committee will be appointed to work on the Roxy Ann project, however, it will take a longer time to complete this as there are a great many more owners of property that will have to be dealt with on account of the length of this proposed road.
