3 BADLY HURT IN \$1,500,000 FIRE AT DETROIT, MICH.

DETROIT, Nov. 28.—Fire starting from an overheated stove in a watchman's shanty early today destroyed the Detroit and Windsor Ferry company dock, housing United States immigration and customs offices, spread to the six-story Munger building which was burned to the ground and then destroyed a four-story warehouse and several small buildings on Woodward avenue and Bates street. When the fire was brought under control a few minutes after five o'clock this morning, the total loss was estimated at \$1,500,000.

The warehouse of the Finsterwald Furniture company was consumed by the flames, fanned by a brisk easterly breeze. The fire swept section, at the foot of Woodward avenue, was one of the oldest in the city and some of the buildings burned had been standing fifty years. They were as tinder before the flames.

Three persons were injured, one probably seriously. Frank Kelly, a fireman, was knocked from a ladder when a hose slipped from the hands of a hoseman. He fell thirty feet to the ground. Robert Yates, the watchman, was burned about the face and hands when he attempted to check the fire.

Carl Kreslin, another watchman, was overcome by smoke. Every downtown fire company, many from the outlying sections and three fire boats fought the flames.

FLORIDA SUSPECTS ARE RELEASED

BUSHNELL, Fla., Nov. 28.—Three men arrested here last week on suspicion that they were the D'Autremont brothers, wanted in Oregon in connection with the Southern Pacific train robbery in the Siskiyou mountains on October 11 were released last night, according to Sheriff Coleman. Further information from the west convinced him they were not the men wanted, the sheriff said today.

The men were released on information sent by Sheriff Terrill that the description of the suspects did not tally with the D'Autremont brothers.

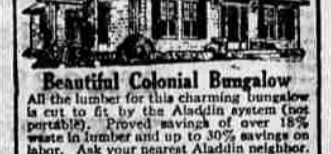
