CITY TAX TOTAL FIXED FOR NEW YEAR AT \$79,112

The city council at its meeting last night passed an ordinance making the annual city tax levy for the year 1923.

It will not be known just what the tax levy will be until the assessed valuation of property is known, but it will be much more than last year's levy, which was 14.09 mills, based on an assessed valuation of \$4,672,000, when the total budget footed up \$66,456. The total asked for this year is \$79,112.

The city council's portion of this year's tax budget was approved without any change by the state tax conservation board, but the latter board cut down by \$8300 the city water commission's part of the budget which called for \$20,300, leaving the commission \$12,000.

The ordinance passed last night was worded in part as follows:

"There shall be levied for the year 1923 the following taxes upon the assessed valuation for the taxable property in the city of Medford, as shown by the assessment roll for Jackson county, for the year 1923 for the following purposes, to-wit:

General fund, including all departments of the municipal government.....	\$46,726.00
Bonded sinking fund.....	6,000.00
Floating indebtedness.....	7,600.00
Library fund.....	6,786.00
Water fund.....	12,000.00

A total of\$79,112.00

CITY COLLECTIONS \$2641 A MONTH

Interesting figures of payments made on assessments and note collection for the past month are made by Mary A. Webber, city treasurer. During November the treasurer's office collected \$2641.81 on notes and mortgages.

The city's deposits last month for treasurer's receipts were \$7590.58. This work included the above amount collected on notes and mortgages, and also \$4185.39 for taxes, the balance being sundry collections.

The deposits for assessments last month were \$2822.02, and \$2057.17 in the past two days, making a total of \$4879.19 for assessments. The deposit for assessments will of course increase during the month as the collections begin to come in, as they now have merely started.

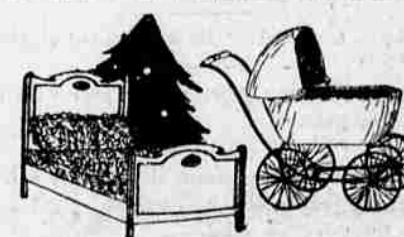
