

PRESIDENT WILL EULOGIZE HARDING BY RADIO MONDAY

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—The air will be cleared for fifteen minutes next Monday night from 8:30 to 8:45 eastern standard time, while President Coolidge speaks to the whole nation by radio in eulogy of Warren G. Harding.

Secretary Hoover, whose department has jurisdiction over commercial radio and broadcasting activities, has requested all stations to withhold message; the navy department has agreed to suspend all wireless operations except S. O. S. and other emergency calls, the army will be silent and virtually all communication between ships and their land stations is expected to cease.

President Coolidge, who is honorary president of the Harding Memorial association will speak into a microphone in his study at the White House and his voice will be carried by long distance telephones to various parts of the country where it will be amplified and broadcast by radio.

OIL PRODUCTION SHOWS DECREASE

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—The daily average gross crude oil production of the United States decreased 115,250 barrels for the week ending December first, totaling 2,083,000 barrels, according to the weekly summary of the American Petroleum Institute. A decrease of 103,000 barrels in the daily average production of the Powell field in Texas accounts for substantially all of the decrease of 115,250 barrels. The daily average production east of the Rocky mountains was 1,133,650 barrels, a decrease of 103,300 barrels. California production was 746,350 barrels, a decrease of 11,950.

Daily average imports of petroleum at principal ports were 217,143 barrels, compared with 249,286 for the previous week. Daily average receipts of California oil at Atlantic and Gulf ports were 165,857 barrels compared with 233,571 for the previous week. There were no changes reported in crude oil prices for the major districts. California crude ranges from 60 to 76 cents a barrel, depending upon the gravity of the oil.

MISSING GIRL STILL TOO ILL TO LEAVE

VANCOUVER, B. C., Dec. 6.—Miss Nell Austin, who is recuperating in the Vancouver general hospital here, is the result of her experiences following her disappearance from Seattle, November 25 and who was found unconscious in this city a few days later, will not be well enough for several days to return to her home or to discuss at any length the circumstances surrounding her departure from the Washington city, hospital authorities declared here today. The Vancouver police said today that they would drop the case until Miss Austin was in a position to discuss "certain features" of the case more thoroughly.

CONGRESS ADJOURNS AFTER MESSAGE IN RESPECT TO HARDING

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—Having perfected its organization and heard President Coolidge's annual message, the new congress today as its first act took official notice of the passing of President Harding. Both senate and house adjourned until Monday out of respect for his memory.

The senate passed without discussion two bills presented by Senator Willis of Ohio, giving Mr. Harding's widow an annual pension of \$5,000 and granting her the mail franking privilege. Both bills go to the house.

The house unanimously adopted a resolution by Representative Burton of Ohio, authorizing appointment of a committee to be composed of a house member from each state, to co-operate with a similar senate committee in suggesting some way in which congress can give evidence of its regret over President Harding's death.

BLACK ARK TO SAIL FOR AFRICA, FEBRUARY

SAN PEDRO, Cal., Dec. 7.—The Rev. J. E. Lewis, builder of the "Ark of the Living God," which sank during its launching here three years ago, has left for San Francisco to purchase the old navy collier Brutus, which he says will be used as the nucleus of a fleet to carry all members of the black race in America back to Africa. The Brutus, he explained before leaving for the north, will sail from this port next February for Monrovia, on the west coast of Africa, with 2000 tons of freight and 200 Afro-American passengers.

"The black man has no future in this country," he added. "Soon you will see us established in the new empire of Ethiopia."

PRESIDENT FAVORS 'RELIEF TO GERMANY'

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—German proposals that the reparations commission authorize the floating of a loan by Germany to cover foodstuffs purchased are assured of the moral support of the United States.

The only connection of the Washington government with the matter will be, however, an expression thru James A. Logan, American observer on the commission, of the willingness of this government that priority should be extended for such a loan.

ELDERLY SALEM WOMAN IS DROWNED IN RACE

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 7.—The body of Mrs. Lena Luckner, 60, was found in the mill race near her home here this morning under circumstances which indicate suicide, according to Coroner Lloyd Rigdon. Members of the family reported to the coroner that Mrs. Luckner has been in ill health and despondent for some time.

Another Football Victim.
CHICAGO, Dec. 7.—Arthur Van Dam, a soldier at Fort Sheridan, is dead from injuries received in a football game a month ago.
