## Dedication of Corner Stone New M. E. Church Sunday



BISHOP WM. O. SHEPARD

An event of church and civic interest will take place Sunday, December 9, when the corner stone of the new First Methodist Episcopal church is laid. The principal address of the day will be delivered by Bishop Wm. O. Shepard at 11 o'clock in the old church. The corner stone ceremony at the new church will be at 3 o'clock. The address is usually delivered at the time and place of the laying of the stone, but due to weather conditions, it was decided by the committee to have the address in the morning so as not to keep the people too long in the open.

Dr. S. A. Danford, superintendent of the southern district, will be present for the day, and will be the speaker at the evening service. Rev. E. P. Lawrence, president of the Ministerial Association, will represent the other churches of the city at the corner stone ceremony. In view of the proposed union of the Methodist Episcopal church and the Methodist Episcopal church, South, Rev. Mr. Coan, pastor of the local Southern Methodist church, will place a trowel of mortar on the stone as evidence of the Christian good will of the two denominations.

Mrs. George Andrews, director of the choir, has planned special music for the day. At the morning service

Dudley Buck's great anthem, "Te Deum," will be rendered. The solo parts will be taken by Mrs. Van Scoyoc, Miss Victoria Andrews, Mr. Maddox, and Mr. Fish. The offertory number will be a bass solo by Mr. George Andrews. At the afternoon service "The Corner Stone Hymns" from the Hymnal will be used. At the evening service, Shelley's famous anthem, "Saviour When Night Involves the Sky," will be sung. Mrs. Sasnett will take the solo part.

The corner stone for the new church will be unusual in several respects. It was specially selected at the Ashland quarry by the pastor and Mr. Hicks of the local granite company. It will be two feet six inches long by one foot, four inches wide. The inscription will be in raised letters on a hammered stone surface. A raised cross will ornament the stone on the side. A sealed copper box containing a copy of the Bible, the Methodist Discipline, a list of those who have contributed to the building, the official board and building committee of the church, a historic sketch, local papers, church periodicals, etc., will be placed in the stone and sealed all around with asphaltum, thus preserving this data indefinitely, without any possibility of deterioration. The public is invited to the services of the day.

## War on Medford Jay-Walkers

New Traffic Regulations for Pedestrians Will Soon Be Issued By the Medford By Club.

The rules for pedestrian traffic are as follows:

1. All pedestrians must keep to the sidewalks and to the right and have to pass one another on the right.

2. Whoever wants to stop on the sidewalk must select his stopping place in such a manner as not to hamper passersby.

3. All unnecessary stopping on bicycle and bridle paths, as well as sudden stepping back, is dangerous and forbidden. Streets are to be crossed the shortest way possible, that is, at right angles to the sidewalks at an even or, if necessary, quickened pace, but in no case in headless haste.

4. It is advisable to cross streets, not at any place, but preferably at the street crossings, and then, in so far as the momentary traffic situation permits, under protection of vehicles moving in the same direction.

5. When one approaches the Nash Hotel corner from the West, turn to the right, from the East, to the left; just a whisper off Main Street to the Gusher Cafe, and Eat Where the Eats Are Good.
