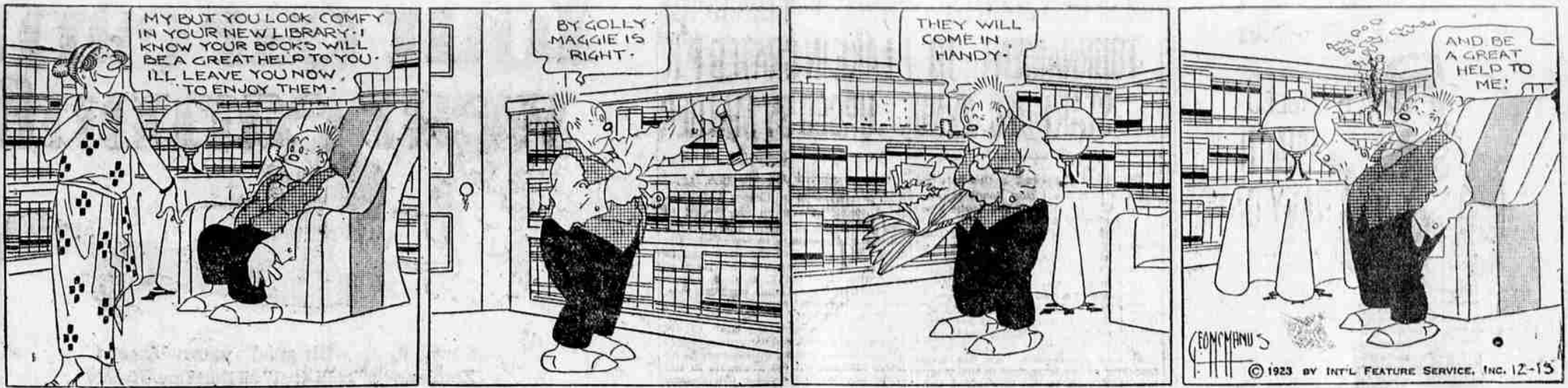


## BRINGING UP FATHER



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LIMITING PRICE  
BASEBALL STARS  
DISCUSSED ONLY

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—The regime of K. M. Landis as high commissioner of baseball, today continued in full sway, strengthened by the joint meeting of major league clubs. Out of the joint meeting came fourteen amendments to the rules, two of which were considered important. One gave the commissioner authority in claims and salary disputes affecting umpires, the other provided that coaches shall be considered in the player limit for clubs.

The schedule for buying players for large sums was reported to have been discussed by the major league club owners but without any action being taken. The reports said it was the sense of the meeting that \$25,000 should be a maximum price for any ball player.

Two deals of major importance were consummated last night, one sending Ray Kremer of Oakland, Cal., club to Pittsburgh as a pitcher and the other sending Dudley Lee, shortstop with Tulsa, Okla., to the Boston Reds.

STORM WARNINGS ON  
THE PACIFIC COAST

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 13.—A cold spell which settled upon this section late yesterday was driven away by a storm sweeping in from the ocean. Storm warnings were up along the coast today.

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—The cold snap which swept over the central middle west will continue but for a day or two, the weather bureau indicated in its forecast today.

"Although the temperature has fallen decidedly from the Rocky Mountain region eastward over the upper Mississippi valley and western lake region," the weather bureau stated, "the temperature readings are not unseasonably low at any point, minimum of zero or lower being confined to the Canadian northwest."

BANKER ACQUITTED  
OF EMBEZZLEMENT

CLINTON, Iowa, Dec. 13.—J. W. Reihman, former president of the now defunct Grand Mound, Iowa Savings bank, was found not guilty of embezzlement by a district court jury here today. He still faces sixteen other indictments, charging embezzlement, larceny and forgery.

Reihman who is charged in the indictments with having made off with many thousands of dollars, was arrested several months ago near Baker, Idaho, six months after the closing of his bank by the state banking department.

RAILROAD LABOR  
BOARD DECIDES  
G. N. LABOR FIGHT

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—The United States railroad labor board today handed down a decision affecting the Great Northern railroad in the widespread jurisdictional dispute over yard employees between the switchmen's union and the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen. The board ruled that either of these unions could call for a ballot of yard employees to decide which shall represent these employees. The switchmen claim that they have a majority among yard employees, although the trainmen now hold the contract with the road for employees in that class of service.

This decision was in the nature of an addition to previous decisions in the same dispute as affecting other roads and would also permit the railroad to call for a ballot on the question if they choose.
