

TILLAMOOK CALVES CAN BE PURCHASED THRU COUNTY AGT.

A number of farmers have been interested in purchasing dairy calves from high producing cows, and registered sires, in order to build up the dairy industry in this county. It is not possible always to purchase high grade dairy cows, but it is possible to build up this industry by buying calves from cows that have made records of 350 or more pounds of butterfat per year. Such calves can now be purchased at \$12 per head f.o.b. Tillamook. Express and freight charges will make this amount about sixteen dollars laid down in this county.

Jersey, Holstein and Guernsey calves can be obtained. Accompanying each calf will be a statement showing the production of the dam and name and number of the sire. The records of these cows are official, due to the fact that only calves from cows that are tested by the Cow Testing association will be sold.

Any farmers interested in this matter are requested to communicate with the county agent's office in regard to the details.

SENATOR JOHNSON ATTACKS RULING SOUTH DELEGATES

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—Indications are becoming clearer that the republican national convention may be the scene of a sharp fight over the national committee's action in restoring the delegate strength of southern states in its expected revision this week of reapportionment figures.

This trend, first developed during the committee's discussion of the question became more marked today with publication of statements by Senator Johnson of California, a candidate for the presidential nomination and Chairman John T. Adams of the committee, attacking and defending the action.

While it has not been determined whether the Johnson organization will fight the southern delegate restoration on the floor of the convention, Senator Howell of Nebraska, who opposed the revision at the committee meeting, holds that the reopening of the question was without authority and has expressed the belief that it brought before the convention the decision would be set aside.

Senator Johnson, in his statement, characterizes the revision as an act by which "the republican states are penalized" and the "southern states, where there is no republican party and where delegations sometimes are a farce and a scandal, are rewarded."

Chairman Adams, on the other hand, says the revision adds only nine delegates to the 1920 apportionment of the southern states, as compared with 116 for those which went to President Harding.

FRANK TROEH CHOSEN FOR OLYMPIC TEAM

CHICAGO, Dec. 14.—The American Olympic trap shooting team was tentatively selected with alternates, today by zone chairman of the Amateur Trapshooting association. Those who accepted the invitation to represent this country at Paris trapshooting events will probably have to meet their own expenses, the association announced.

The selections include: Pacific coast zone—Frank M. Troeh of Portland, and G. L. Becker of Ogden, Utah, as alternate.

CHINESE BANDITS LOOT TOWN AND CARRY OFF WOMEN

SHANGHAI, Dec. 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—Three thousand bandits under the leadership of the notorious chieftains, Chen Yen-Teh and Wang Han-Ying, captured the town of Chaho Wednesday, burning and looting the houses and carrying off the magistrate and education commissioner and two other officials, together with more than 100 residents of the town, including many women, according to dispatches received here from Changsha.

Inhabitants of the town who escaped from the bandits during the pillaging of their homes fled to the nearby city of Kwai Yang. They reported that the magistrate of Chaho was slain after he had been taken prisoner.

The town is in the southern part of the island province of Hunan, which is west of here. Changsha is the capital city of the province and more than 100 miles north of the scene of the bandit outrage.

Banditry in Hunan province follows sporadic outbreaks by large armed bands to the northward in Honan and the adjoining provinces, which culminated recently in the looting and burning of the town of Likwankia, in southwestern Hunan province. Two thousand dead and wounded were left behind amid the smoking ruins of Likwankia by the bandits, many having perished when tied together, covered with kerosene and set afire by the marauders.

It is not known at present whether there were any missionaries of foreign nations in the vicinity of the town of Chaho when it was raided, or if there were, whether they were molested.
